EAA Chapter 538 Monthly Meeting Minutes for February 8, 2022

- 1. Called to order at 6:31 P.M.
- 2. Twenty-five members and fourteen visitors were in attendance. The visitors were Ian Arnold, Diana Hernandez, Brian Henderson, April Logulo, John Kennedy, Phil Corbell, Terry Zellers, Kurt Longuirand, Don Eiswtraut, Adam Carroll, David Spuelack, Ned Richer, Matt Habib, and Michael Fox.
- 3. Darren lead the visitors introductions of the above visitors.
- 4. Ivan and Phil from FAA lead the presentation of the WINGS program for both pilots and non-pilots. Usually they are one (1) hour videos or in person meetings like tonight. Those who attend or view the videos can get up to 10% discount on insurance. The statics show that the accident rate has dropped from .066% down to .033% for those who use the program. Access to the material is via phone, computer, or in person like tonight. Sign-up at FAA Safety by using a unique e Mail address. They showed the various pages that are on the website and the various sub-menus. Pilots have to have a practical review every two years. But by taking courses online it can be delayed. They emphasized that if you have an accident CALL the NSTB. After every video etc there is a quiz and afterwards you can retake the questions that you missed. There are checklists for the different areas you want or need. After logging back in you can review your history of all the WINGS activities you have completed. The presentation was followed by some Questions and Answers.
- 5. We took a break and resumed at 7:37 P.M.
- 6. Darren noted that the Luke open house scheduled for March 19 and 20. After the meeting, I found out that it was canceled.
- 7. There was a scheduled Young Eagles Flight on January 29 but has been canceled.. We are expecting 75 people. The next one is on Saturday April 9th, with that many Young Eagles we need 15 planes and pilots. The event is followed by a potluck luncheon at Dave Biddle's hangar. The next one is in June for the ACE academy students.

Taming the Tailwheel Shimmy



AIRPORT OF THE MONTH - WINSLOW





CITY OF WINSLOW AZ FROM WIKIPEDIA.

Winslow (Navajo: Béésh Sinil) is a city in Navajo County, Arizona, United States. According to the 2010 census, the population of the city is 9,655.[2] It is approximately 57 miles (92 km) southeast of Flagstaff, 240 miles (390 km) west of Albuquerque, New Mexico, and 329 miles (529 km) southeast of Las Vegas.

HISTORY

Winslow was named for either Edward F. Winslow, president of St. Louis and San Francisco Rail Road, which owned half of the old Atlantic and Pacific Railroad, or Tom Winslow, a prospector who lived in the area.

The last Harvey House (La Posada Hotel), designed by Mary Colter, opened in 1930. The hotel closed in 1957 and was used by the Santa Fe Railway for offices. The railroad abandoned La Posada in 1994 and announced plans to tear it down. It was bought and restored by Allan Affeldt[4] and it serves as a hotel.


U.S. Route 66 was originally routed through the city. A contract to build Interstate 40 as a bypass north of Winslow was awarded at the end of 1977. I-40 replaced U.S. Route 66 in Arizona in its entirety.

Winslow achieved national fame in 1972 in the Eagles / Jackson Browne song "Take It Easy" which has the line "standing on a corner in Winslow, Arizona."

The airport was constructed in 1929 and the City of Winslow rapidly changed. Many transcontinental flights landed daily in Winslow by the 1950's. With the introduction of jet airplanes the stop for fuel was no needed as it had been and activity at the airport quieted down.

Today, the airport serves primarily privately owned planes and slurry bombers when firefighting from the air is needed in Northern Arizona.

WINSLOW-LINDBERGH REGIONAL AIRPORT

Winslow-Lindbergh Regional Airport (IATA: INW, ICAO: KINW, FAA LID: INW) is 1 mile (0.87 nmi; 1.6 km) mile west of Winslow, in Navajo County, Arizona.[1] The U.S. Forest Service has a firefighting air tanker base here. The airport was served by TWA and Frontier Airlines but now sees no airline service. The airport was built in 1929 by Transcontinental Air Transport (TAT). Aviator Charles Lindbergh, who served as head of TAT's Technical Committee, chose Winslow as one of twelve critical refueling stops on the nation's first transcontinental passenger line. For many years it was the only all-weather airport between Albuquerque, New Mexico, and Los Angeles, California. In 1930 TAT merged with Western Air Express and the new carrier became Trans Continental and Western Air, or TWA. Ford

Trimotor aircraft were first used followed by the Douglas DC-2 in 1934 and the Douglas DC-3 in 1937. During World War II the airfield was used by the United States Army Air Forces Air Transport Command as a refueling and repair stop for military aircraft.[2] The airport is dedicated to the memory of Melvin L. Kislingbury, a Winslow resident who was killed in a WW II flight mission in Louisiana in 1943.[3] TWA's service to Winslow ended in 1953 when the airline retired its DC-3's and acquired much larger Lockheed Constellation aircraft which were capable of flying from Los Angeles to Albuquerque without refueling.



Historic Airport

1048 AIRPORT RD, WINSLOW, AZ 86047

This is a "must see" for aviation enthusiasts...

Just as the great passenger trains stopped regularly at La Posada, so too did the passenger planes stop at Winslow's airport. Winslow watched all the notorious aviators touch down and plenty of famous movie stars who were traveling east from Los Angeles or headed back to Hollywood.

In 1928 the Nation's first passenger airline was created. It was the Transcontinental Air Transport Co., aka TAT Airlines. The new airline planned a route stretching from coast to coast, and rather than carry mail they carried people. It was a novel concept at the time..

As chairman of the technical committee for the airline, the famed aviator, Col. Charles Lindbergh was assigned to map the exact route and to design the airports that would dot the nation.


