
The break started at 7:14 P.M.







This airplane is brand new, it is still in phase 1, has about 20 hours on the Hobbs meter. It has dual 10 inch HDX Dynon's primary flight displays. Also has the auxiliary radio and auto pilot on the panel. The airplane holds a little over 39 gallons of fuel. The fuel burn is around 5 1/2 to 6 gallons per hour. That is premium car gas by the way. Because the 914 is a turbo charged engine the higher you go the better efficiency you get. You can expect 140 to 150 mph with the wheel pants on. probably 5 mph or so less without the wheel pads. The prop is a whirlwind ground adjustable prop. The manufacture doesn't think that a constant speed prop would add much to the performance of this engine so I didn't spending the \$13 or \$14K, just didn't make sense. As far as landing the airplane goes, I only have about 15 landings on her and I am still getting used to it so I can't really tell you whether she's going to be an easy airplane to land or not. It sure does fly well, very predictable.

I haven't painted the airplane yet, still trying to decide on a paint job. By the way, I am the builder of the airplane. Bought a quick build kit from the company and hired a professional Avionics team to install the Avionics. First two pictures are not my airplane, but are about as close as you can get to it and I thought you might like to see them.

On July 9, 2023 Marc Halcomb did the first test flight on his design configuration for a single point fuel injection system a VW speed part), Microsquirt ECU, high pressure fuel regulator, Tuner studio software, Walbro fuel pumps, a number of GM auto sensors, and a custom header tank for return fuel on his Arion Lightning 3300A Gen 4 engine. This is the same engine that Marc designed the supercharger platform. The new fuel system replaces the original Bing carb and a subsequent ROTEC TBI used with the supercharger.

The fuel injection (absent the supercharger), increased the cruise speed at 3000 rpm (Airmaster 2-blade constant speed prop)from 145 mph to 153 mph. This fuel injection system has a much

lower cost than the aftermarket SDS multipoint fuel injection system.

With this improvement in fuel delivery, Marc expects the high speed cruise with the supercharger will from from the low 170 mph range to near 180 mph with much smoother performance. A higher flow VW fuel injector may be required for the supercharged configuration.




Nogales (Spanish for 'walnut trees'; Spanish: [no'yales]; English: /nə'ga:lıs/ or /noʊ'ga:leɪs/[4]) is a city in Santa Cruz County, Arizona. The population was 20,837 at the 2010 census and estimated 20,103 in 2019.[5] Nogales forms part of the larger Tucson–Nogales combined statistical area, with a total population of 1,027,683 as of the 2010 Census. The city is the county seat of Santa Cruz County.[6]

Nogales forms Arizona's largest transborder agglomeration with its adjacent, much larger twin Nogales, Sonora, across the Mexican border. The southern terminus of Interstate 19 is located in Nogales at the U.S.–Mexico border; the highway continues south into Mexico as Mexico Federal Highway 15. The highways meeting in Nogales are a major road intersection in the CANAMEX Corridor, connecting Canada, the United States, and Mexico. Nogales also is the beginning of the Arizona Sun Corridor, an economically important trade region stretching from Nogales to Prescott, including the Tucson and Phoenix metropolitan areas.


Nogales is home to four international ports of entry, including the Morley Pedestrian Port of Entry, Dennis Deconcini Pedestrian and Passenger Vehicle Port of Entry, Nogales International Airport, and the Mariposa Port of Entry. The Nogales-Mariposa Port of Entry has twelve passenger vehicle inspection lanes and eight commercial inspection lanes.


Due to its location on the border and its major ports of entry, Nogales funnels an estimated \$30 billion worth of international trade into Arizona and the United States, per year, in fresh produce and manufactured goods from Mexico and the world through the deep sea port in Guaymas, Sonora, Mexico. This trade helps to support tens of thousands of jobs and the overall economies in Ambos Nogales and throughout the American state of Arizona and the Mexican state of Sonora.[7]

The town is named for the black walnut trees which once grew abundantly in the mountain pass between the cities of Nogales, Arizona, and Nogales, Sonora, and can still be found around the town.

Slowed down this month as well – Its now officially HOT (105+) so I usually work for only a couple of hours in the morning.

I dressed the lady for pictures – put the cowls and spinner on, checking clearances as I went, and took pictures. From the glare-shield down it looks ready to go! I also sent in the paperwork to the FAA to get it registered. Then took the cowls off to add the air filter and finish the cabin heater. Should be relatively quick.

The air filter was quick. Its located in a NACA vent attached to the lower cowl - so just connect the SCAT tubing and the air sensor to the mounting plate and let it hang until the final cowl install.

That ended the easy.



welded outer surface of the muffler were OK - just needed \$45 worth of parts. But that is another week waiting. I was able to get the muffler off and put the new pieces back on without removing the muffler from the aircraft - a small consolation.

Then it was time to dive into the foot wells to secure and connect the vent controls. Did I mention it is HOT? And with a center stick – it's hard to position yourself to get both arms and head in there. With the help of a lot of towels as cushions and frequent breaks - I did get the job done, but it took a coupe of mornings work. The last little bit I did was add the

SCAT tubing from the muffler to the vents and to the NACA vent on the other side of the lower cowl. So there is another hanging tube to be connected when the lower cowl goes on.

The "flaps" that control the hot air also block holes in the firewall when closed – so they are stainless steel - and I was fresh out of sharp drill bits to drill the mounting holes for the hinges. So I had to order and wait for them. While waiting I did put in a lot of the inspection plates that I haven't had a chance to do yet, including the tunnel covers. Then I realized that to route the vent controls - I needed the tunnel covers off. Once I had the drills I finished the vent boxes and riveted them to the firewall.

Fortunately I realized access to the vents would be hard once they were installed. They are located in the foot wells underneath the rudder pedals. So I installed what hardware I could before the vents were riveted in.

I also tightened up the heater muff around the muffler. The clamps just keep turning - until suddenly the got easy to turn. You guessed it - I had crushed the side pieces of the heater muff! Fortunately the muffler and all of the controls on the center console are now in and I have gotten to the end of the kit manual.



Now I have to go back and pick up the things that were deferred (canopy, aft windows and interior paint and the big items.)


