#### PRESIDENTS SEPTEMBER REPORT

Hello again, EAA Chapter 538 members, family and friends.

I looked at my weather app on my phone and shows the temperatures finally going below 100 degrees. I expect the occasional hot day but now getting progressively cooler. Those who have projects in hangars or garages, will begin to get a lot of work done. I look forward to project reports as we move forward into fall and winter.

I wish to notify everyone that we have taken possession of a Stitts Playmate from Jim Mc Kenney. This aircraft was donated to us. This aircraft was built by Leroy Castle, the namesake of our chapter. It bears the registration number of N538LC. While the registration has expired with the FAA, it is placed in a standby status to allow for the aircraft owner to reinstate the registration. Carlos Hernandez, Tad Daughters, Stewart Snow and myself went to Gila Bend Airport to pick it up. The trailer needed a bit of work to re-grease the axles, replace tail light lenses and replace the tires to make the trailer safe for travel. The aircraft is now safe at my home but I am looking for a better place to keep it. The wings fold up to make it transportable by trailer. If anyone has a sheltered place to keep it, please let me know.

We would like to make this aircraft available to a chapter flying club. This would be an ideal opportunity for anyone who does not have an aircraft at this time. The flying club has yet to be formed so we are looking for anyone who would be interested in joining. This would be a club that is separate from the chapter. It would be necessary to create a formal organization with its own bylaws and establish rules of operation. Then it will be necessary to raise funds to return the aircraft to operation. The aircraft is in great shape but needs some work for having been stored for a long time.

Jim McKinney also had a lot of shop equipment and a good portion of it was purchased by chapter members. Items included a lathe, mill, standing drill press, metal cutting band saw, 20 ton press, bend brake and others. While this equipment is personally owned, one has stated that his equipment will be located at the chapter hanger and would be available to members for their projects. I have my own equipment that I plan to donate. Based upon the list of items, there will be the potential to fabricate many items for your projects. We had a donation of benches and cabinets for the chapter but lost the storage location. Several members got together to move the items to Alex Bodak' garage for temporary storage. Thank you everyone and Alex for your support. Our hangar project is experience delays in the approval process. While this is frustrating, we can' proceed until all the preparations are complete. We must patiently wait to get all the approvals. It does not appear that we be done with construction this year but most likely next spring. It was our plan to have a pancake breakfast once the hangar got to a certain level of completion to celebrate our project. Since the hangar is being delayed, we will probably have postpone the first event. Also, due to rising costs, we continue to need monetary donations toward the hangar project. If anyone can help, we would greatly appreciate it.



I sent Larry an email, but I did not hear back from him until today. He is fine with donating to your EAA chapter. 



## History

AJO is the Spanish word for garlic (Spanish pronunciation: ['axo]). The Spanish may have named the place using the familiar word in place of the similar-sounding O'odham word for paint (o'oho). The Tohono O'odham people obtained red paint pigments from the area.

Native Americans, Spaniards, and Americans have all extracted mineral wealth from AJO's abundant ore deposits. In the early nineteenth century, there was a Spanish mine nicknamed "Old Bat Hole" that was abandoned due to Indian raids. Tom Childs, Sr., found the deserted mine complete with a 60-foot (18 m) shaft, mesquite ladders, and rawhide buckets in 1847. He did not stay long at that time, because he was on his way to the silver mines near Magdalena de Kino, Sonora.

Thirty-five years later, Childs and his son returned with a friend and started developing the abandoned mine.

In the year 1884, the camp at AJO was practically abandoned. Not a soul was in camp when Tom Childs Sr., and his son arrived. With them was Washington Michael Jacobs of Tucson, Arizona ... Childs and Jacobs located the mining claim which constituted most of the old AJO group of mines. They made a permanent camp and worked the mines.

High-grade native copper made AJO the first copper mine in Arizona. Soon the Arizona Mining & Trading company, formed by Peter R. Brady, a friend of Childs, worked the rich surface ores, shipping loads around Cape Horn for smelting in Swansea, Wales, in the mid-1880s. The mine closed when a ship sank off the coast of Patagonia. Long supply lines and the lack of water discouraged large mining companies

With the advent of new recovery methods for low-grade ore, AJO boomed. In 1911, Col. John Campbell Greenway, a Rough Rider and star Yale athlete, bought the New Cornelia mine


from John Boddie. He became general manager of the Calumet and the Arizona mining company and expanded it on a grand scale. The Tucson, Cornelia and Gila Bend Railroad was built from Gila Bend to serve the mining industry and was in service from 1916 to 1985. In 1921, Phelps Dodge, the nation's largest copper company, bought New Cornelia and the mine became the New Cornelia Branch of Phelps Dodge, managed by Michael Curley. For several decades more than 1,000 employees worked for Phelps Dodge in the open pit mine. In 1983 union-affiliated mine employees went on strike. The mine continued with non-union labor for a short while before stopping production in 1985.


The town was originally segregated, with neighborhoods called Indian Village and Mexican Town for the non-white residents. AJO is home to many retired people, Border Patrol agents, and young families.

#### ERIC MARCUS MUNICIPAL AIRPORT (FAA LID: PO 1)

Eric Marcus Municipal Airport (FAA LID: P01) is a county-owned, public-use airport in Pima County, Arizona, United States. It is located 5.75 miles (5.00 nmi; 9.25 km) north of the central business district of AJO[1] and is about 82 miles (71 nmi; 132 km) southwest of Phoenix. The airport was renamed on February 11, 2006; it was formerly known as AJO Municipal Airport.

Eric Marcus Municipal Airport covers an area of 1,375 acres (556 ha) and has one runway designated 12/30 with a 3,800 x 60 ft (1,158 x 18 m) asphalt surface. For the 12-month period ending March 31, 2006, the airport had 300 general aviation aircraft operations, an average of 25 per month. The airport was established on 22 August 1941 on approximately 1,426 acres near AJO, Arizona as part of the expansion of the Army Air Corps prior to the United States entry into World War II. It was designated a sub-post of Luke Army Airfield as part of the Gila Bend Gunnery Range in Maricopa County, with small detachments being stationed at the airfield. The 543d School Squadron operated from AJO Field operating towing aircraft for aerial gunnery practice.





## Things to do in AJO, AZ.















#### - MEMBER BUILDS SHARING -

My report on my RV 12 is below. I won't be at the meeting this month as we are going on vacation. See you next month. This month is good news. I had "stalled" waiting on the wing kit. It got here Jul 14 and it is already complete. Even better, the fuselage kit is in crating at Vans. I put in about 150 hours on the wing (133 for the Empennage kit). I'm retired & this is my "full time" job. Even so I seem to put in about half time on actual building though what I log is building is only the actual build time. Writing logs, ordering parts, experimenting with primers etc. does not get logged. Vans alodined the main spars but did not do the rib attach angles they installed. The first picture is the spars with the alcald angles installed and the angles vans installed primed. The second is the frame completed, wires not yet installed. The third picture is the second wing with the first bottom skin installed, the wiring is visible in this picture, the blind rivets certainly contribute to the speed of the build here - Getting access to the back of the skins to buck solid rivets would change the build process a lot. With the blind rivets -just drop the skin in place and pull the rivets.


The next picture is of the installed landing light. Vans provided instructions on how to install it after the wing was closed, I think it was a lot easier to install when the back was open.

The next picture shows how the counterweight is mounted in the flaperon nose. The last picture is the completed wings in the holder I built. The flaperons are not mounted until final assembly, but they sit nicely (almost) in position in the rack. Paul Fisher


