

Own or Lease a Chapter Facility By Serena Kamps, Chapter Field Rep I, EAA Lifetime 10110280 December 2021 –

Whether you rent a space or have built or bought a hangar, if your chapter has a space to call its own, you know how beneficial it is. It simplifies meetings, gatherings, and events, provides space for storage and build projects, and creates a sense of chapter pride and belonging as members have a place to hang out at the airport. A chapter facility gives you the freedom and ability to do things when and how you want.

As you can see from the pictures, chapter facilities are as diverse as chapters themselves. As defined by our chapter insurance program however, a chapter facility is a space that the chapter owns, leases, or has 24/7 access to for at least 30 consecutive days. If you have such a facility, you should be purchasing insurance that includes facility insurance during renewal. When you do this, your chapter receives this recognition point.

Although obtaining your own chapter facility may seem like a lofty goal, it is definitely something each chapter should be working toward. You'll need to have the support of the entire chapter to be successful. Having clearly established goals for what you will do with your facility once obtained is a key part of gaining this buy-in. Establishing the "why" also helps you to make a solid case when fundraising. When you have a clear understanding of your fundraising goals and a proven record of good things your chapter does for the community and communicate these well, it might surprise you the number of people willing to make generous contributions to your cause.



Cibecue (Western Apache: Dishchii' Bikoh "Horizontally Red Valley/Canyon") is a census-designated place (CDP) in Navajo County, Arizona, United States, on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation. The population was 1,713 in the 2010 United States Census. The current council leaders are Arnold Beach Sr. and Tony Alsenay.

The Cibecue community has a high unemployment rate, which was exacerbated by the Rodeo-Chediski Fire, Arizona's second-largest wildfire in recorded history. Education is the sector that employs the most people in the community.


Transportation. Cibecue Airport is a public use general aviation airport located four nautical miles (7 km) southeast of the central business district of Cibecue. The White Mountain Apache Tribe operates the Fort Apache Connection Transit, which provides local bus service.

Education. The area is served by the Whiteriver Unified School District and the Dishchii' Bikoh Community School. Dishchii'bikoh Community School, [a] also called the Cibecue Community School, is a small K-12, grant-funded day school in Cibecue, Arizona. It is run by the Fort Apache Agency, a division of the Bureau of Indian Affairs. The school's superintendent is Juan Aragon. The school is subdivided into an elementary, middle, and high school, each with a separate principal.



Cibecue Airport (FAA LID: Z95) is a public use airport located 4.6 miles (4.0 nmi; 7.4 km) southeast of the central business district of Cibecue, in Navajo County, Arizona, United States.[1] It is owned by the White Mountain Apache Tribe.[1] This airport is included in the National Plan of Integrated Airport Systems, which categorized it as a general aviation facility. Cibecue Airport covers an area of 163 acres (66 ha) at an elevation of 5,037 feet (1,535 m) above mean sea level. It has one runway designated 7/25 with a gravel and dirt surface measuring 4,200 by 100 feet (1,280 x 30 m).

IVAN MANOOGIAN MAKES PROGRESS ON HIS SAILPLANE.



PAUL FISHER RV-12 BUILD

A lot of progress on the fuselage, though there still are supply issues. The fuselage is built out from the center section. The first picture is with the tank/baggage area added aft op\f the center, The second shows the seat ribs sticking up behind the center section (seats are forward of the center, picture taken from the aft looking forward).

The next picture shows the attachment mechanism for the removable wings. The wing spar slides in above the black roller and below the white block. Each spar has a pair of bushings like the copper colored ones in the center bulkhead that line up with those bushings and receive a BIG PIN that ties the wings to the center section. The BIG PIN has a locking pin with micro-switches that illuminate a BIG RED light on the panel if they are not in position, as well as lock out the starter. The loads are all concentrated here - the landing gear attaches to the bottom of the grey center bulkhead, and the seats are immediately in front, fuel tank and baggage behind. This also minimizes CG shifts by putting the variable weight close to the wing.

PAUL FISHER RV-12 BUILD CONTINUED

The next picture is the fuselage upside down, getting skins installed. Note the small pieces of skin on the corner to cover what is a compound curve.

The final picture is right side up, showing the area in front of the seats where you step into the aircraft. The next section is the foot well & firewall. No ribs in that section but a center tunnel up to the firewall provides strength. The engine mounts bolt through the firewall to brackets on the tunnel.


Supplies needed - I damaged a tunnel stiffener when I hit the flange when squeezing a nut plate rivet - new part on order. Vans sent a notice that they made an error bending the longerons for some kits - of course I have the incorrect parts - they will ship shortly. I need fuel tank sealant to seal the 3 piece firewall together, 3.5 OZ tube on order. I also need a small amount of tank sealant to seal the position light farings to the wing tip. Might as well do that with the firewall, but first I need to fill the gaps around the faring with flox - procuring the epoxy locally. And Vans still owes me some parts that were back-ordered when I got the kit - not needed yet - but I will soon.
