#### 1. Tucano-Replica

The 2nd Arizona Tucano Replica kit is now located at the Geronimo Experimental Build Center in Marana Arizona. The build center is owned and operated by Greg Hobbs.

Greg is the current Exhibition Chairman for the COPPERSTATE Fly-In.

The Tucano Replica is a 3/4 scale design modeled after the Embraer Tucano military trainer and light air-to-ground attack support aircraft used by many of the world' militaries.

It is a great flying airplane and can be purchased as a kit, S-LSA or completed experimental with a variety of factory assist options. I've now flown 12+ hours in a 912 version with a supercharge (140 hp)and really enjoyed getting back into a complex aircraft...of course the engine out scenarios had me doing a lot more thinking about drag/glide ratios with the flying bricks extended and precious little airspace left to maneuver. The bubble canopy and Texas heat definitely helped me lose a couple of pounds.


The average delivery time for an S-LSA is 4 months. A retractable gear model with a 915is Rotax and constant speed prop will take about 6 months. You can still enjoy Oshkosh pricing. \$125,000 for a VFR basic panel (EFIS). A 915is version will be \$135,000 + your choice of avionics. Give me a call at 703-307-6775 for AZ Aeroservices.

#### 2. Savannah S.

AZ Aeroservices is becoming a dealer for I.C.P NA. At the outset, we will be selling the Savannah S. The Savannah S can be purchased as an S-LSA for \$74,950 with a basic VFR suite and a Rotax 912ULS power-plant. It exhibits excellent light sport STOL capabilities. I fly an Aerotrek A240 and the flight characteristics are very similar, although the very low speed characteristics of the Savannah are even better. The Savannah is a mere 16 pounds heavier and boasts a little wider cabin, easier entry (center stick & larger door), superb visibility forward, above and sides. The baggage area can be reached in flight without having to maneuver through the steel tubes on the Aerotrek. At \$20K less than an Aerotrek, the all aluminum Rotax powered Savannah is one of the best values for your dollar in the light sport arena.

The Mayor and Council, acting as the legislative body, determine Town policy. The Town Manager proposes new policies and implements and administers policy adopted by the Town Council. The Town Manager is also responsible for development and administration of the Town's operating budget once approved by the Mayor and Council. The Mayor and Council appoint the Town Manager.

#### OFFICE OF THE TOWN MANAGER Anna Flores, Manager


The Town Manager is the Chief Executive Officer for the Town, and is ultimately responsible for the general operation of all Town services, programs, and functions. The Town Manager also acts as an Ex-Officio Officer on all Commissions and Boards.

#### OFFICE OF THE TOWN CLERK Martina Burnam, Town Clerk

The duties of the Town Clerk are to maintain a true and correct record of all business transacted by the Town Council and any other record that pertains to the business of the Town or that the Council directs. The Clerk keeps all public records and public documents as provided by State Statute. The Mayor and Council appoint the Town Clerk.

The Town Clerk also acts as the Town Treasurer, keeping accurate and complete records of all financial aspects of the Town. Payroll, purchases, and billing fall under the scope of the Town Clerk.

The Town Clerk is the Town Election Official and performs those duties required by State Statute for the Election process.







#### Inbound, Ground & Parking Procedures

Inbound traffic will first listen to AWOS (119.625). It will be updated throughout the day. After listening to AWOS, announce your intentions on **CTAF (122.975)** for entering the traffic pattern. Buckeye Municipal Airport is an *uncontrolled* airfield and will remain so throughout the event.

The airport will be closed to all traffic during the air show on Saturday and Sunday from noon until approximately 2:00pm.

Upon landing, make sure to display one of the following signs in your aircraft windshield so it is visible to ground personnel and monitor ground operations (121.05). Use one of the links below to print the sign that corresponds to your aircraft parking need (please print using landscape orientation):

General Aircraft Parking

Show Plane (being judged)

Aircraft Vendor

Aircraft Camping

Aircraft For Sale

Advise any aircraft ground personnel when you are ready to startup and taxi for departure. They will assist you with a "Wing Walker" escort from parking to the taxiway. Monitor ground operations (121.05) while taxiing to the active runway.

Also, please submit an Aircraft Registration & Judging Form in advance (click button to the left - only fill out the Judging portion if you're going to have your aircraft judged).

#### **Ultralight Procedures**

The ultralight strip is approximately 1300'X 50' and is a well-graded dirt strip. It is parallel to and located east of the main paved runway 17-35.

The ultralight strip will be closed from noon until 2:00pm during the air show Saturday and Sunday. Please check NOTAMs as times may vary.

All ultralight traffic must arrive from the east or south, landing to the north. All departures must be to the south. When departing, make sure there is no inbound traffic. Do not fly west or north of the ultralight runway.

Ultralight runway is limited to Ultralight Aircraft, Light Sport Aircraft, and Homebuilt Rotorcraft.

The ultralight parking area is located along the eastern edge of the general aircraft parking area. There is a taxiway connecting the ultralight runway and the ultralight parking. No sign is required for ultralight parking.

Tent camping only is allowed in the ultralight parking area. There is no fee for tent camping. Any camper with wheels must use the designated COPPERSTATE Western Skies campground. No campfires are allowed in the ultralight parking/camping area.
