PRESIDENTS APRIL REPORT

Welcome Members, Family and Friends of EAA Chapter 538.

I reached a personal milestone recently. I spend a year remodeling my Workshop, then another year remodeling the house. I was finally able to finish it last January. Both of these have taken much longer that I planned. I had also planned to do some landscaping work to be done during the winter months. While it was still cool, I also wished to get two new trees planted by my front sidewalk. In order to ensure that the trees would survive the summer, I would also need to dig the first portion of the irrigation system. I began this by digging out an old tree stump and two new 4 x 4 holes. Then to dig a trench for irrigation line. All this work was done with a pick and shovel. Also completed was an updated planter that is on both sides of the front sidewalk. I really wanted to get this done before it gets too hot. Now this is done, I get to move my work inside the shop.

Now for the fun stuff. I recently purchased a Starduster project and I am now able to work on it. The project came with 2 and ½ wings already built. My plan is to dismantle the ½ wing (upper left) and use it as a pattern to build the upper right wing. Both wings will then be built simultaneously. The first thing to fabricate are going to be the wingtip bows. In order to make the bows, I need to make the pattern. Fortunately, I have a sheet of spare plywood that will work well for this purpose. I am presently laminating two sheets together to make it thick enough. Next it will be to layout the points along the curve. Within the next few days, I will receive my material order from Aircraft Spruce and I can begin this project.

Our hangar project continues to move forward. We are still in the design phase but are nearly ready to submit our plans to the City of Glendale. Once the plans have been submitted, it will need to go through a review process. It may be returned for revision. Should the plans be acceptable, it will go the City for approval. Once approved, we can begin.

We continue to need donations for the hangar. Steel costs have risen dramatically and as a result of this, all costs have risen. Should you wish to make a donation, either material or monetary, it will be greatly be appreciated.

I would like to plan our next fundraising event for this fall. In the past we have had successful pancake breakfasts. I would like to have a breakfast this fall during October or November. Our hangar should be nearing completion and it would be the perfect place to have it. There will be more on this later.

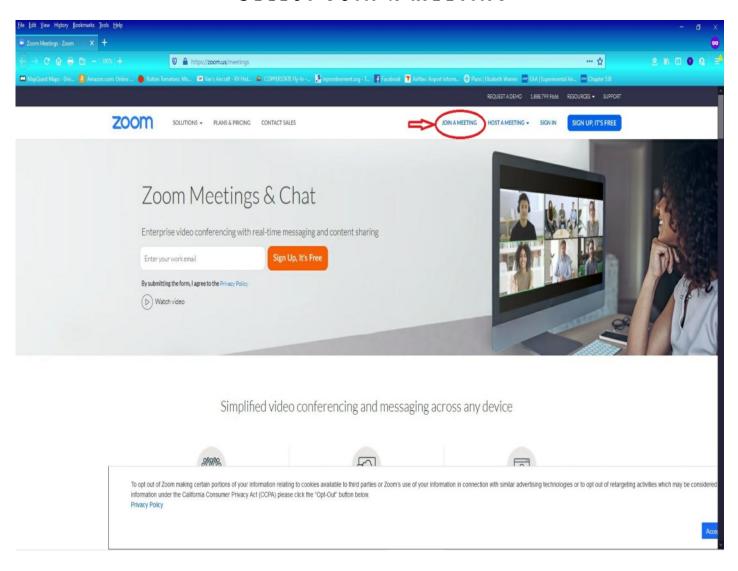





AIRPORT OF THE MONTH - SHOW LOW AIRPORT



Show Low is a city in Navajo County, Arizona, United States. It lies on the Mogollon Rim in east central Arizona, at an elevation of 6,345 feet (1,934 m). The city was established in 1870 and incorporated in 1953. According to the 2010 census, the population of the city was 10,660.

Name and history

According to a legend, the city's unusual name resulted from a marathon poker game between Corydon E. Cooley and Marion Clark.

The two men were equal partners in a 100,000-acre (400 km2) ranch; however, the partners determined that there was not enough room for both of them in their settlement, and agreed to settle the issue over a game of "Seven Up" (with the winner taking the ranch and the loser leaving).

After the game seemed to have no winner in sight, Clark said, "If you can show low, you win." In response, Cooley turned up the <u>deuce</u> of clubs (the lowest possible card) and replied, "Show low it is."

As a tribute to the legend, Show Low's <u>main street</u> is named "Deuce of Clubs" in remembrance.

In 2002, a large forest fire, the <u>Rodeo-Chediski Fire</u>, threatened the city and forced an evacuation. The fire was extinguished less than a half mile from the city's border, and Show Low was completely spared. The city is near extensive forests, and is a popular recreational area.

Airport

The Show Low Regional Airport was dedicated in 1946 as the result of a U.S. Forest Service Special Use Permit. Since its modest beginning from a dirt runway and small terminal, the Show Low Regional Airport has become the premier air transportation facility in the White Mountains.

Located 1 mile east of Show Low, the airport features 2 runways with parallel and connecting taxiways, a modern 6,400-square-foot terminal building, short- and long-term vehicle parking lots, and 3 aircraft parking ramps.

Airport Runways

Runway 7-25 is 100-feet wide by 7,200-feet long. This runway is PCL lighted, with PAPIs and REIL equipment on both approaches. It has a weight-bearing capacity of 60,000 pounds for dual-wheel, main gear aircraft. Aircraft as large as Gulfstream IVs and Challengers can easily be accommodated.

Runway 4-22 is 3,920-feet long by 60-feet wide, with a weight-bearing capacity of 12,500 pounds. Equipped with runway edge reflectors, this runway is used frequently as the crosswind runway. This runway provides easy access to all parking ramps and is directly adjacent to the general aviation south ramp / hangar area.

Terminal

Opened in August of 1999, the new terminal building provides a comfortable atmosphere for both commercial airline passengers and terminal tenants and customers. Businesses include Enterprise, Hatch Toyota, and Show Low Ford car rental pickup/drop off, and Botique Airlines. Wi-Fi is available in the terminal building.

The airport terminal is open 365 days a year. Airport linemen are on duty year-round providing Jet A and 100LL AvGas fuel and aircraft oil, as well as other services including aircraft jump-starting, light towing, ground power, and engine preheating. Self-service AvGas and Jet A is available 24/7 from 2 above ground fuel tanks located west of the terminal building. Users of the self-serve pumps pay 25 cents per gallon less than the full-service truck price.

An Automated Weather Observation System is available on 118.075 or by telephone at 928-532-0379 for upto-the minute weather conditions. Instrument approaches at KSOW include RNAV (GPS) and NDB-A.

Pilot Briefing Room

A pilot briefing room, with Internet access for weather and flight plan filing, is available. Vending machines offer snacks and beverages. A conference room with TV and VCR/DVD, fax machine, and copier are also available for a small fee.

Advertising Opportunities

In addition, advertising opportunities are available for businesses wishing to promote their services. A large display area with an accompanying speed dial telephone can be used for custom-made advertisements and company brochures. Other advertising locations are also available throughout the terminal. The UNICOM office has full details on cost and availability of advertising opportunities in the terminal.







Picked up this evaporation cooler earlier this week in preparation for the summer heat. Hopefully it'll help!

Finished the fitting, trimming and drilling of both wing root fairing's and seals. They came out good. I'm happy with them. These cover the gap between the wing and the fuselage. This should take care of the last bit of the wing prep for this inboard end of the wing. Need to remove them one more time to add the plate nuts that are used for all these holes I just drilled

to fasten everything together.

Rather than paying by the day, a campsite is staked out until the convention ends. Chapters are able to purchase in advance two to six campsites at a flat rate in order to establish a chapter base of operations. Since the campsites will be staked out in advance, each chapter can direct its members to camp in the vicinity of this area.

Request a Campsite

The following guidelines apply to this special opportunity:

- Chapters can secure two to six campsites for a special flat rate of \$252 per site. Additional sites may be acquired under the usual camping rules and pricing.
- 2. At least one camper per individual camping site credential must be a current chapter member and a current EAA member through the end of AirVenture Oshkosh. A list of EAA members to attend with the chapter (who must be current through the end of AirVenture Oshkosh) will be provided in writing to the camper registration staff with the chapter camping request form.
- 3. Offer excludes improved sites (water and electric) and sites in Paul's Woods, 101 Woods, handicap, and generator areas.
- Chapter camping is only available in Camp Scholler, aircraft camping is excluded from this offer.
- 5. EAA staff will stake out these campsites for the chapter beginning on or around Monday, July 5, 2021. Due to the camp ground already being open for weeks, chapter camp sites will be staked out as close as possible to the desired locations listed by the chapter.
- 6. No refunds due to early departure are allowed for these campsites.
- Chapters must comply with the policies and guidelines stated in EAA's current camping guidelines.
- The chapter leader or chapter designee will manage all chapter camping credentials.
- 9. Potential updates are being considered in 2021 to provide campground credentials to the chapters by one of two methods, yet to be determined:
 - A chapter designee for each chapter will arrive first and pick up the camping credentials for all chapter campers and be available to
 distribute them to their respective campers as they arrive. The chapter designee checking in the chapter must present the chapter
 camping confirmation form, which will be emailed to them after payment is processed by EAA.
 - 2. A chapter designee for each chapter will be mailed camping credentials for all chapter campers and distribute the credentials to their respective campers prior to arrival at Camp Scholler. The chapter designee will be mailed all credentials during the week of July 5, 2021 after payment is processed by EAA.
- 10. All sign ups and payments must be received by June 25, 2021.
- Chapters are not permitted to occupy their site until Saturday, July 10.

Basic Campsites

stake out a spot in advance of the arrival date selected. On or after the arrival date, EAA members must check-in at the Camper Registration building to receive their camping credential. Basic sites are not marked or assigned. Once credential is issued, the member may locate and stake out an unoccupied spot in the campground. Individual basic campsites are not marked out but are to be sized to accommodate your camping unit and one transient vehicle with a 5' perimeter. Camping units must be a minimum of 10' apart. Any campsite deemed too excessive will be resized by EAA Security. All camping units and vehicles must be located behind the fire lanes. Fire lanes are marked as burn lines in grass or with signage. Camping credentials are not valid in EAA Public Parking Lots. Camping credentials must be visibly displayed on both on your camping unit and transient vehicle. Additional vehicle and visitor parking passes of the overflow (S Lot) may be purchased at the Camper Registration building. S Lot parking passes are not sold online. Camping credentials and campsites may not be transferred from one EAA member to another individual. Unused days calculated from the arrival date through the Monday after AirVenture, less a three-day minimum, may be refunded upon checkout. Any roped off unoccupied site without proper credentials will be Removed.


