Our next meeting is coming up this Thursday, August 13th. This month we will be meeting at Gary Baker's hangar at Medina Airport (1G5). Thanks to Gary for hosting this month's meeting. You may want to bring your own chairs. The forecast for Thursday looks like it should be no problem to have the meeting with the door open. However, if we do have rain to the point we can't leave the door open, we will cancel the meeting for this month.

As if there hasn't been enough change and uncertainty this year, the FAA has implemented a new process for applying for an Airworthiness Certificate. The system is called the Airworthiness Certification Tool

(AWC). Initially, this new process was to be released earlier this year, however, with Covid and issues with the program it was delayed until the end of June. Now all Airworthiness Applications will be done electronically through this web application system. https://awc.faa.gov/AWCExternalApplicant/Splash/Index. Within the applicant portal, there is a User Guide to help you navigate through the system. Like any other on-line system you will have to create a user name and password to have access to the system. When doing the application, there are documents that are submitted as part of the complete application document package; Application for U.S Airworthiness Certificate, FAA Form 8130-6; Eligibility Statement for Amateur Built Aircraft, FAA Form 8130-12; Program Letter, which includes your proposed flight test area. The 8130-6 will be completed within the tool itself and will be signed with an electronic signature. The other document will be uploaded to the system. As the applicant, when you submit the application in the system, it will go the FAA office you have selected. In our area that would be

the Cleveland MIDO. Once it is at the FAA office, they will make the decision to delegate the activity to a DAR or to perform the certification themselves. Because of Covid, the FAA ASI's in our area are all working from home and not doing Airworthiness Certifications.

I have started to use the AWC to do airworthiness certifications, so I am slowly moving up the learning curve. This new process is here to stay and like with any new system there are "bugs" to be worked out and learn how to use the system. I have been working closely with my FAA Advisor to learn the system and to

establish an efficient means of working together using this tool for airworthiness applications. When starting the process, I would recommend completing all the documents out prior to entering the information into the system.

This way you can review the document and ensure it is absolutely correct before completing the document in the system. It is much easier to make the corrections on a hard copy then after it has been completed in the system. Since it is new, you should anticipate more lead time for the DAR and/or FAA to process the application.

Another change that has come about using the new system is the way the Airworthiness Certificate is generated. As most of you know, when a certificate was issued, the builder would receive the "pink ticket" and Operating Limitations, stapled together. Well, those days are gone. The AWC system now generates the Airworthiness Certificate and Operating Limitations all as one document. You will no longer receive a "pink ticket." This is an end of an era. For me, when I would issue the airworthiness certificate, that "pink ticket" represented the culmination of all the hard work, effort and sacrifice the builder had poured into that aircraft. Like other changes in our live, in time, this will become the new normal. If you will be looking to make application for an airworthiness certificate in the near future, please feel free to contact me and we can walk through the process together.

New Colorado Aviation Weather Cameras Operational

The Colorado Division of Aeronautics has announced that 52 new aviation weather cameras installed in partnership with the FAA's Alaska Weather Camera Program are now operational. The cameras are located on 13 AWOS stations in Colorado and designed to provide a way for pilots to get a near-real-time visual picture of weather conditions in the Colorado Rockies before leaving the airport. They are the first weather cameras to be integrated into the FAA Weather Camera Program outside of Alaska.

"The Colorado Division of Aeronautics is excited to have had this opportunity to partner with the FAA in yet another joint effort to enhance aviation safety in Colorado," said Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) Aeronautics Director David Ulane. "The Division is proud to continue our heritage of pioneering new initiatives that further our mission to help advance a safe, efficient, and effective air and space system in Colorado." As previously reported by AVweb, the Colorado Division of Aeronautics allocated \$226,000 to FAA for the weather camera project via a reimbursable agreement. Under the terms of the agreement, the FAA assisted with the installations and the state of Colorado owns and maintains the cameras. The new weather cameras, along with those located at more than 230 sites in Alaska, can be accessed at https://weathercams.faa.gov.




All avionics are installed, Weight & Balance completed, and I had my first engine start on August 1st. The engine ran perfectly! I'm getting very close to completion.

Minutes of the
June 11, 2020 Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 19:00 by President Matt Tomsheck.

-The meeting was called to order at 19:05 by President Matt Tomsheck.

Matt welcomed everyone to the meeting and introduced our guest: Jarrod Pape

Matt also welcomed our new members who joined prior to the start of the meeting: Casey Keibler,

Chris Oehlers, Chris Sopko, Case McIntyre, Leah McIntyre, and Grey McIntyre.

-June Meeting Minutes

Minutes from the June 11, 2020 regular chapter meeting were approved as written with no additions or corrections. Motion to approve the minutes was made by Bob Taylor and second by Fred Coblentz. Motion passed unanimously.

-Officers reports:

President: Matt thanked Paul for handling last month's meeting in his absence.

Vice President: Paul reported he is working on the chapter fly-out/campout at Freeman Swank Field and will give more details later in the meeting.

Treasurer: Gary reported there are sufficient funds in the treasury for chapter business. Thus far this year the chapter has spent \$2900, with \$2100 of that being spent on preparing the mustang for sale. He announced there are currently 74 paid club members for 2020. Gary also described the Amazon Smile Program and reminded members there is information about it in the July newsletter.

Secretary: Greg reminded members the Chapter Board of Directors meeting minutes are also in the July newsletter.

Builder/Restorer Plaque Presentations: Matt Tomsheck

Matt presented a builders plaque to Jay Waddell for the

completion and flying of his RV 9-A. The project was completed in 7 years. Matt presented a restoration plaque to Randy Brooks for a complete nuts and bolts restoration and flight of his 1940 J-3 Piper Cub. Randy's project was completed in 6 ½ years.

-Ray Scholarship Update: Matt Tomsheck

Matt reported 2020 Ray Scholarship recipient Ferenc Somogyi's flight training has been put on hold due to Corona virus concerns. EAA has been contacted and has no problem with letting this ride out. Ferenc is continuing to work on the written exam.

-Air Academy: Matt Tomsheck

Matt reported that due to the cancellation of the 2020 Airventure and Air Academy, we have a guaranteed slot available for the 2021 Air Academy. Unfortunately our Air Academy Scholarship recipient from this year will be unable to attend in 2021. The chapter will need to pursue finding another candidate.

-T-51 Mustang update: Matt Tomsheck

Matt gave an update on the condition of the Mustang and the decision by the Board to have a broker sell the airplane for the chapter. He reported a brokerage agreement had been signed and showed a copy of said agreement. The Mustang is already being advertised and the final agreed on commission charge was 10% of the sale price. The brokers will advertise the airplane for 90 days.

Matt asked the chapter to give the Board of Directors the authority to sell the Mustang without the need for a chapter meeting and vote. A motion was made by Bernie Ockuly and second by Dave Manning to give the EAA Chapter 846 Board of Directors the authority to approve the final sale price of the Mustang as they deem best for the chapter. The motion passed unanimously.

-EAA Project Completion Resource: Jay Waddell

Jay went over the program EAA provides for after you have completed your project. He discussed the Test Cards and Flight Test manual EAA recommends be used for the 40 hours of flight testing after your project is completed. He also talked about the Flight Test Box used during

these 40 hours.

Jay also reminded the chapter he is again doing the completed project plaques. These plaques include a picture of the project and are to be placed in the hangar so everyone can see all the completed chapter projects.

-Hangar Swap:

Jeff Paden was not in attendance, so there was no new information to report.

-Sonex Project: Matt Tomsheck

Matt reported the decision had been made to part out the Sonex. Some of the parts were sold at the last Board meeting. Randy Brooks is taking the table to assemble for the chapter. We have the plans for the project which have value, but have not been sold yet. Matt said the remaining parts need to be inventoried. He will send out an email to set up an evening for doing this.

-Flying Club: Gary Baker

Gary reported that Dale Housley owns a 1963 Cessna 150C that he is interested in selling. The airplane has 3400 total hours with 300 hours on the engine since overhaul. Engine overhaul included a new crank, cam, and cylinders. Gary discussed there had been previous interest in starting a flying club of chapter members. He reminded members the airplane cannot be associated with the chapter but membership in the flying club can be limited to chapter members. Gary also reported the major expenses involved with the flying club would be purchase of the airplane, maintenance of the airplane, hangar expenses, and insurance. Gary said the plan would be to use \$24,000 as a starting working number to purchase the airplane. There are links on the EAA website for setting up flying clubs. Anyone interested should contact Gary Baker. If things move forward on this, Dale would like to have things completed by the end of September.

-Flyout to Freeman Swank Field: Paul Lutz

Paul reported the fly-out is scheduled for July 17-19 at

Freeman Swank field in Butler Ohio. Paul is considering it to be our mini Oshkosh. Dave Gerdeman has agreed to cook the Saturday evening meal. Dave will be cooking 2-3 deep fried turkeys depending on the number of people expected from the pre-sign up count. There is a \$10 cost per person to cover expenses and everyone is asked to bring a side dish to share. So far 31 people have signed up to attend. Dinner Friday night is on your own. Paul said they would like to do pancakes Saturday morning and asked for a volunteer to cook the pancakes. The Hancheck family volunteered. Freeman Swank Field is a 3000 foot, well maintained grass strip. Last year 12 airplanes and 40 people attend the fly-out. There are full bathroom facilities with showers as well as a porta pot.

Matt Tomsheck- Built a rotisserie to use on his JUST Aircraft Highlander

Matt showed the video a video from EAA President Jack Pelton. Jack discussed moving forward from the EAA cancellation of Airventure 2020, EAA staffing during this time, and EAA's financial position without the revenue from Airventure 2020.
