Maintenance and repairs began on the chapter's Titan Mustang. During the monthly meeting, Pete Klapp, the 2018 Chapter MVP, presented Jeff Paden with the 2019 Chapter MVP award. Chapter By-Laws were updated and approved. Paul Lutz introduced presenter Bill Repucci from South Carolina. In a harbinger of the year to come, Bill gave his program on magneto timing and electronic ignition via the internet!

IMPORTANT UPDATE: FAA and Covid-19 Vaccinations

From FAA.gov, as of 12/12/20: "To maintain the highest level of safety in the National Airspace System, the agency will require aviation professionals with medical certifications or medical clearances to observe a period of 48 hours following the administration of this vaccine before conducting safety-sensitive aviation duties, such as flying or controlling air traffic. Because the Pfizer vaccine requires two doses, 21 days apart for maximum effectiveness, this waiting period applies after each dose.

The FAA anticipates taking no additional measures to ensure safety after the initial window for side effects closes. However, the agency's medical professionals will continuously monitor the initial distribution of the novel vaccine and documented clinical results and will adjust these recommendations as needed.

The FAA will evaluate vaccines from other manufacturers as they receive FDA authorization in the coming weeks and months and will advise pilots and air traffic controllers of any waiting periods required for those vaccines.


The FAA applies similar brief waiting periods after administration of other vaccines, including those for tuberculosis and typhoid."



EAA is launching a new online learning event for aircraft



builders: (www.EAA.org/HomebuildersWeek). It will be five straight days of educational forums covering a broad spectrum of aircraft building topics. It will launch on Tuesday, January 26, 2021, and run until Saturday, January 30, 2021. The live online presentations will be open to everyone interested in building their own aircraft. Sessions will start at 1 p.m. CST and run until 8:30 p.m. CST daily.

This event is an opportunity for a new person to jump in with both feet and learn a lot about the wonderful world of homebuilding. We will cover areas like getting started successfully and techniques when building with sheet metal, composites, steel, and wood. But it won't be just for the newbie; we are offering in-depth talks on panel planning, engine selection, FAA certification, flight testing, and selling a homebuilt aircraft. There will be something for every builder, whether you are just starting out, knee deep in a project, or just received your airworthiness certificate — it is going to be a great learning opportunity.

EAA is working with industry experts, kit manufacturers, and other subject matter experts to provide top-notch material for builders. The sessions will be live and allow plenty of time for attendee questions. Recordings will be archived and available to EAA members for review.

-November Meeting Minutes

Minutes from the November19, 2020 meeting were reviewed, and the time of adjournment was corrected from 20:41 to 21:41. With no other additions or corrections to be made, a motion was made by Randy Brooks and second by Gary Baker to approve the minutes. The motion passed.

-Mustang Update: Randy Brooks

Randy reported that Jeff Paden picked up the starter for the Mustang from Bill Koleno. Bill Koleno said he was working toward securing a deposit on the airplane.

-Air Academy

The Air Academy is planned for July 20, 2021 through July 28, 2021. We need applicants in the 16 – 18 year age bracket. February 5, 2021 is the deadline for application.

Ray Scholarship: Mike Guenthner

Mike reported Ferenc Somogyi, the Chapter's Ray Scholarship recipient, is ready to go. He has chosen an instructor and has received the starter kit from EAA. Mike will meet and go over the program with his instructor.

-Officers Reports:

President: With Matt Tomsheck being absent, there was no President's report.

Vice President: Paul Lutz reminded chapter members about Matt stepping down as President and asked for a volunteer to take over this very important position. He informed members they would only be serving the one remaining year of the two year term. Paul also recognized and thanked Steve Greer for the \$500 donation he made to the chapter through State Farm insurance.

-Treasurer: Gary Baker reported there were sufficient funds in the bank account for chapter business. He also reported the chapter had 99 paid memberships, the most the chapter has ever had. He reminded the membership they can pay their dues via PayPal on the chapter website.

-Monthly Program: Gary Baker, Jason Lorenzon Gary Baker:

Gary went over the different color blue lines depicting Class Bravo airspace on Foreflight. There are two different shades of blue lines, with the lighter blue line being correct. He advised using the December 8, 2020 update and the difference will be corrected. The lines depicting Class Bravo airspace were misprinted by Jeppesen. He noted that other airports may also have the same discrepancies, so pilots should check before flying to avoid an unknowing incursion into Class Bravo airspace.

Jason Lorenzen:

Jason presented a program on the legal aspects of buying an airplane as well as addressing the Covid-19 situation and legal issues pertaining to our medicals. Jason is a chapter member and an attorney, with about 95% of his practice is dealing in aviation law. He made chapter members aware the program tonight would be approved for FAA WINGS credit. Jason's program provided several good points to follow/consider when purchasing an airplane:

Do your due diligence before you buy. Look closely at log books.

If you have a good mechanic, make them your best friend. Look at the Contract for Sale forms available on the EAA and AOPA websites.

Make sure the airplane is free of all liens before you proceed with purchase.

Never purchase an airplane in your own name. Always use an LLC to purchase an aircraft. The LLC can also be incorporated in a trust.

In regards to the Covid-19 vaccine update, Jason recommended going to your AME first, as the vaccine has not yet been approved by the FAA for use by pilots.
