

Ray Scholar Update

Our newest Ray Scholar, **Jack Pomfret**, has been fully approved by the Ray Scholarship program for \$6,600 in funding to help him finish the rest of his training and earn his Private Pilot certificate. We recently received his funding from EAA meaning Jack can finally begin his journey as an EAA Ray Scholar under the watchful eye of our Chapter!

Five Years of Ray Scholars!

Chapter 846 is finishing another successful year of participation in the Ray Scholarship program. The goal of the program, since its inception in 2019, has been to provide deserving area youth with the opportunity to earn their pilot certificate and inspire those youth to be the next great generation of aviation professionals and enthusiasts. We have been blessed to have two Ray Scholars earn their Private Pilot certificates this year with a third on the way towards completing his certificate in early 2024. Since 2019, Chapter 846 has supported seven Ray Scholars in total with Ben Nagy, Abby Donofrio, Case McIntyre and Logan Cohara so far completing their pilot certificates with Jack Pomfret on schedule to finish early next year.

In total our Chapter has been able to award more than \$40,000 in flight training scholarships since 2019 through the James Ray Foundation, EAA and even our own funding on behalf of our Chapter! In addition, all of the scholars listed have qualified for and received a free LightSpeed Aviation ANR headset at no cost through the Ray Scholarship Program. Jack Pomfret has also recently been approved and will be receiving his headset in the near future.

This also marks the second time that we have been able to secure multiple Ray Scholarships in the same year! The future of the Ray Scholarship program looks bright both for EAA and within our Chapter and thanks to the generous support of the Ray Foundation, EAA, Chapter 846 and its members, we look forward to many more years of participating in this wonderful program!

Chapter dues expire at the end of each calendar year, so here we are at the end of 2023 and guess what? Dues are due. So, unless you recently joined the chapter (after September), have already paid, or are a lifetime or honorary member, a payment of \$25 should be made at your earliest convenience. Don't forget to update on the Membership Form any changes to your contact information.

We are closing out the year at 117 members. Sixteen folks decided to join the chapter this year. Thank you to all new members! Your membership is appreciated, and I hope you are enjoying being a part of one of the largest Chapters in Ohio.

For comparison, there were twelve new members in 2022 included in the total of 111 members. We had twenty new members join in 2021 as part of the 110 total membership! We have had a paid membership of 99 or more for the past four years.

We have had 48 new aviation enthusiasts join our chapter in the past three years. Unfortunately, eight of the new members in '21 and '22 did not renew, as well as 10-15 members in each of the previous years. It is hoped that all current members will renew in 2024.



The Telegram app has proven very useful to plan and share flyouts and developments within our group.



President Chris Oehlers called the meeting to order at 19:11.

Board Members Present: Brad Wurst, Chris Oehlers, Gary Baker, Greg Cantrell, Randy Brooks, Dave Gerdeman, Paul Lutz, Paul Hancheck, Brian Burke, Ron Lutz.

Members Present: Kevin Fink, Dave Manning, Newsletter Editor Karl Aber.

President Chris Oehlers went over the template for the Fred Coblentz Scholarship. Copies were given to Board members for study and decisions will be made at the next Board meeting.

The Board voted in favor of accepting a second Ray Scholarship from EAA. As per previous discussions and vote, this scholarship will be awarded to Jack Pomfret. He will need to complete an application to EAA to be awarded the scholarship.

Brian Burke, Chairman of the Ford Tri-Motor Tour Stop, gave an update of the final numbers for the event. We flew 58 flights with 508 paying passengers. We received a check from EAA for \$5105.15 which included money from sponsorships. We also made \$950 from the



auctioning of two Tri-Motor shadow boxes.

Brad Wurst presented an update and some ideas for the Tool Crib. He estimated a cost of approximately \$500-\$700 for current improvements. After these are complete, future improvements would be approximately \$1500-\$2000.

Starting time for the party will be 5:00 p.m. Decorating will be that morning and a sign-up sheet will be at the December meeting. The Chapter will provide the main course with members being asked to bring a side dish or dessert.

Chris reminded the Board of the need for nominations of members to serve as Officers or Board members for the Chapter. Nominations will be accepted at the November gathering with elections being held at the December gathering.

Dave Gerdeman gave a review of the Chapter Pancake Breakfast and made some suggestions for next year. Overall the event was a great success.

Ideas for gathering programs and safety topic presentations were discussed and a list was made for both categories. Availability of speakers will be investigated and a final schedule of topics will be decided on at a future Board meeting.
