## Free Flight Simulator from EAA!

#### **Great news!**

EAA has confirmed that 846 will be one of the ten beta chapters who receive a free simulator soon. The system is similar to this one from Sporty's. <a href="https://www.sportys.com/eaa-virtual-flight-academy-deluxe-total-sim-set.html">https://www.sportys.com/eaa-virtual-flight-academy-deluxe-total-sim-set.html</a>

The idea behind this is that the simulator will be temporarily given to the Ray Scholar prior to the student beginning training. The student will follow a syllabus that EAA has created with **TakeFlight** with the goal of reducing the total flight training in the aircraft. The syllabus is based on MS Flight Sim. The student will return everything after using it for some specified time.

Mike Guenthner has agreed to be in charge of the simulator and will work with Logan in getting it up to speed. The only cost to 846 will be for a monitor, approximately \$200. We will be given the simulator and software for our use and won't have to return anything to EAA. Another option of using it in the future is as a

method of identifying potential future scholars.

I believe that **TakeFlight** will

have the capability



to report usage by the scholar to us.

This is a new program offered by EAA in an attempt to reduce the cost of flight training. The cost of the ten simulators is being covered by the Ray Foundation contribution.

He was able to get in a couple solo cross-country flights before the gloomy weather set in last month but hasn't been able (like many Ohio pilots) to get any flying done in the past month. Fortunately the weather looks to be improving and Jack is eager to get flying again and finish up the rest of his training requirements so that he can start getting ready for his practical test.

**Future Ray Scholars:** We are still waiting to get the official word from EAA on our 2024 Ray Scholarship application which we expect any day now. Once confirmed, we will begin the application process as we have done in previous years.

If you know of anyone who might be interested in receiving a Ray Scholarship for 2024 through Chapter 846, please have them contact **Mike Guenthner** (216.406.0298) as soon as possible so that we may begin the screening process.

We already have several very well qualified Chapter members who will be applying for the Ray Scholarship this year and we are always seeking motivated individuals who would benefit from a flight training scholarship. Our Chapter will select our 2024 Ray Scholar at our regular March Chapter meeting as we have done in the past.

Flight Simulator Pilot Program: Chapter 846 has been selected as one of ten Chapters nationwide to participate in a trial program for Ray Scholars in which EAA will provide the Chapter with a full home flight simulator suite including all the hardware and software required to begin learning the basics of flying. The Chapter will then loan this simulator to our Ray Scholars to let them begin learning the basics of flying from home. The goal is to give Ray Scholars a head start on their training so that by the time they take their first flight, they have many of the basics already down and hopefully reduce their overall training costs.

Home flight simulators have greatly improved and have become valuable tools in the flight training process whether for basic or advanced training. Our Chapter will be receiving the flight simulator along with the associated software and hardware in the coming months. Once our

2024 Ray Scholar has been selected, our Chapter will be working with them closely to complete a simulator based flight training syllabus prior to their first lesson to provide them the best chance at completing their training successfully and in a timely manner.

Many of you might remember Lieutenant Colonel Michael Young, who spoke to our chapter 846 gathering last March about being an F 16 pilot in the air National Guard. My family and I were invited to his Fini flight which is his final F-16 flight before retiring out of the Air Force, his career started in 1997 when he joined the Air Force Academy and ended in December 2023 to make a total of 26 years in the Air Force.

On December 26, 2023, we arrived at Toledo Regional Airport at the 180th Fighter wing National Guard base. Michael flew with the 112th Fighter Squadron, the



"Stingers", and took us through his routine before a flight in the F-16 beginning with dressing in his flight suit and parachute. He showed us

the parachute training simulator, which is a rack that you hang from to make sure you harness is correct. Afterwards he received a standard weather briefing and flight route briefing. They planned to fly onto West Vir-

ginia and back.



We walked out to the planes and he did his preflight. After the take-off he flew over top of us which was pretty exciting.

We had waited around an hour and a half while they flew down to West Virginia, did their low level training, and flew back. They put on a series of low passes and used up remaining fuel before landing.

Upon exiting his aircraft, his wife was given a bottle of champagne and his kids were provided with water fire extinguishers. His wife poured the champagne over his head while the kids hosed him down with water!



After retiring from the Air Force, Michael is planning on interviewing with United Airlines to become an airline pilot. I am working on getting him to join our chapter and he expressed an interest in doing so. We all wish him the best of luck!


During their visit to southern Florida **Glenn Krafcik** and **Tim Conway** checked off a few of their flying

bucket list items which included:



fly up restaurant, Suncoast Café, located on the field which is open only for breakfast and lunch.





## **Lutz RANS Update...**

#### Center Console

I decided to add a center console made from fiberglass to the RANS. I started by cutting and shaping the foam to size. This would be my mold. I covered the mold with duct tape and waxed it in hopes that the fiberglass would release. Thankfully, it did. I covered the fiberglass with the same fabric we used for the glareshield. The lid is hinged and secured closed with rare earth magnets that are glued to the fiberglass. I added a USB charger inside the console for charging our phones.



#### RV 7 Build...

I am moving forward with the RV 7 build. I am prepping to hang the engine on the plane. But first, I had to convert the engine from fixed pitch to constant speed. This involves ordering parts from the manufacturer, assembly and installation of the propellor governor housing, installation of the prop governor.



Installation of the oil pressure line to the governor, and removal of the exterior crankshaft plug and installation of another plug further in the crankshaft.

Everything is complied with the exception of the crankshaft (deep) plug installation and final

installation of the oil pressure line.


All components are installed in the back of the engine (ignition leads, oil pressure fitting, standby alternator,



# EAA CHAPTER 846 Board of Directors Meeting Minutes of January 31, 2024

The Board of Directors meeting was called to order by chapter Vice President Brad Wurst at 7:12pm.

#### Fred Coblentz Scholarship

Gary Baker will be reaching out to a foundation in Akron to gather more information about managing the EAA846 Fred Coblentz Scholarship. This foundation would administer everything and recommend scholarship recipients. Most similar foundations will guarantee a minimum annual return.

Discussion followed regarding different types of scholarship funds and names.

It was brought up that EAA national does offer a "Named Endowment Scholarship" management service, with different options of services ranging from entirely managed full-service to a more chapter-managed approach. More information was needed on this approach.

A decision was made to form a 3 or 5 person committee to determine funding options. This committee will be open to board members and the chapter members.

#### **Chapter Financials**

Gary Baker started a discussion on how to proceed since the 9-month CD we started in 2023 will be coming to term soon.

A motion was made by Greg Cantrell to reinvest the monies that are currently held in the CD back into a new CD with an interest rate of anything above 4.5%. This motion was seconded by Gary Baker and passed unanimously by a voice vote.

Reminder to check the January newsletter for the 2023 end of year financial statement provided by the chapter Treasurer, Gary Baker.

#### Chapter event model airplane kits

In previous years, balsa airplane kits have been provided to kids that attend chapter events. The price on these kits is now up to \$3.30 each, which is up from the \$1 range of years past.

Discussion followed regarding other kit options and other forms of entertainment for children at chapter events. This included a discussion about the "Build and Fly" program put on by EAA where kids work with chapter members to build a small RC airplane and then learn to fly it.

A motion to purchase a Build and Fly kit from EAA was made by Paul Lutz and was seconded by David Gerdeman. This passed unanimously by voice vote. The decision was made to not pursue the balsa airplane kits any further.

#### **Air Academy applications**

No applications have been received by the 1/31/24 deadline. Gary Baker will send out email to continue to ask for applications for a short period of time.

#### **Tool Crib updates**

Brad Wurst provided a materials list for mechanical components to insulate and put-up walls in the tool crib. Kevin Fink provided a materials list for electrical components to provide electrical outlets and lighting in the tool crib. Both lists and plans will be provided at the chapter gathering to gather approval and feedback.

A vote will be requested at the chapter gathering to authorize funding for the project, not to exceed \$2,500, for project related costs.

Ron Lutz will investigate options of small solar LED lights to offer some light to the walkway and parking area near the hangar deck.

#### **Flight Simulator**

Chapter 846 has been awarded a flight simulator by EAA as a new trial program of the Ray Scholarship program. This simulator will be loaned to new Ray Scholarship recipients to aid in skill building before they step into the cockpit. It may also be set up at chapter events to gauge interest in flying for new Ray Scholarship applicants.

This simulator includes everything except a monitor. The chapter will just need to provide a monitor of our choice. Anticipated arrival is the end of March 2024.

Ray Scholarship Coordinator Mike Guenthner will manage the simulator program. Logan Cohara and Kevin Fink have offered to assist with setup of the simulator.

#### Wings and Wheels - Medina Municipal Airport 1G5

A "Wings and Wheels" fly-in and car show will be hosted by Cold Stream Air Service at Medina Municipal Airport 1G5 on September 7<sup>th</sup>, 2024.

Cold Stream Air has requested chapter 846 to set up an informational table at the event and invite our members to fly-in to the event.
