

Working on a B-25

Last week I was invited to join Brian Safran, Don Helmick's son-in-law, at the Liberty Aviation Museum at

Pt. Clinton
Airport. Brian was
working with a
mechanic and a
pilot who were
going to do
multiple gear
swings of the B25 "Georgie's
Gal." I've seen
Pipers and



Bonanzas on jacks with the aircraft having their gear swung, as well as a B-737, but I haven't seen a B-25 run thru its paces. I spent the afternoon with Brian, Scott, and Todd as they ran the gear up and down thru five cycles. One time the gear was lowered by the emergency procedure, which requires someone to stand behind the

pilots' seats and pump a lever back and forth. This lever releases the uplocks of the landing gear and then pumps hydraulic fluid from an emergency reservoir to lower

the gear. This



lever only needs to be pumped about three hundred times!

I helped Todd out in the cockpit by providing ballast for

the initial gear swings and made myself a bit familiar with the cockpit setup. Later I assisted with lowering and raising flaps and opening and closing the cowl flaps. I was also



able to use my aircraft building skills to safety wire the three gear door bolts, one on each landing gear.

After the required gear swings were completed, we lowered the B-25 on the jacks and had to make sure that the wings were coming down evenly with the nose. This prevented the aircraft from falling off a jack and punching a hole in a wing or the fuselage or worse. The jacks were then pushed over to Charley Cartledge's TBM Avenger, so that he could do the same thing on that aircraft.

It was a fun and educational day! If this sounds like something you might be interested in assisting with, let me know and I can put you in touch with Brian. They are always looking for volunteers.

Answer: The Aeromarine Merlin is an American homebuilt aircraft that was designed by Czech Aircraft Works and is by Aeromarine LSA of South Lakeland Airport,

The design employs access doors that hinge vertically and a conventional low tail. Its 25.6 ft (7.8 m) span wing mounts <u>flaps</u>. The cabin width is 27.5 in (70 cm). The standard engine used is the 64 hp (48 kW) <u>Rotax 582</u> twinsupplied as a kit, for amateur construction. The aircraft is made from aluminum sheet, with the engine cowling made cylinder <u>two-stroke</u> powerplant or new V-twin 4-stroke . The manufacturer estimates the construction time from the supplied kit as two weeks at the factory completion center. Chapter Meeting Minutes of the February 11, 2021

The meeting was held via ZOOM and was called to order at 19:00 by Gary Baker. There were 34 members in attendance.

Gary welcomed everyone to the meeting. He also welcomed new members Lee Preisse and Edward Agoston.

Gary Baker did a review of the EAA Homebuilders Week and reported with over 16,000 people attending the webinars, it was very successful. Gary's webinar on flight testing had more than seven hundred attendees.

-Officer's Reports:

President: Paul Lutz gave an update on the Mustang, reporting it had been sold to chapter member, Jeff Paden.

Vice President: vacant. No report.

Treasurer: Gary Baker reported we have 59 members paid in 2021. He reminded members they can renew their membership through PayPal at the chapter website. He also reported there were sufficient funds in the treasury for chapter business.

Secretary: Greg Cantrell asked if there were any additions or corrections to the February 5, 2021 Board meeting or the January 14, 2021 regular meeting minutes. With no additions or corrections requested, a motion was made by Bob Taylor and seconded by Mike Baker to accept the minutes as written. The motion passed unanimously.

2021 Air Academy Scholarship Application: Gary Baker

Gary reported there was only one applicant this year for the scholarship. He introduced chapter member Case McIntyre. Case told members present about himself. He has a GPA of 4.5 and is a three sport athlete at Strongsville High School. He said the thrill of flying is what got him interested in being a pilot. He hopes to someday fly an F-22 as well as piloting a commercial 787.

By unanimous approval, Case McIntyre was chosen by the membership as the 2021 EAA Chapter 846 Air Academy Scholarship recipient.

Ray Scholarship Update: Mike Guenthner

Mike announced that Ferenc Somogyi had switched his flight training to Aerotrek. Brian Williams will be his instructor and he will still be flying out of Medina Airport. Ferenc is doing his training in a Cessna 172 and will be taking his written exam in the next couple of weeks.

Mike also reported our chapter had applied for and received the 50/50 Matching Ray Scholarship for 2021. This will be our second Matching Ray Scholarship. Mike also went over the Ray Scholarship requirements and asked members to think of possible candidates and give their names to him. He would like to have candidates in line by the March meeting.

Program: Kerry McCauley

Kerry is author of the book, Ferry Pilot: Nine Lives Over The North Atlantic. He has been flying since 1982 and has 9000 hours in over 50 different aircraft and has done a program for the Discovery Channel. He presented many different accounts of his experiences flying small planes over the ocean. Kerry is also an avid skydiver with over 20,000 jumps. He has cut back on his ferrying activity and now operates a skydiving school six months of the year in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

Paul Lutz and Gary Baker suggested making Charlie Cartledge an honorary member of our chapter as a way of thanking him for his \$5000 donation to the chapter that allowed us to provide a second Ray Scholarship. A motion was made by Bob Taylor and seconded by Greg Cantrell to make Charlie an honorary member of EAA Chapter 846. The motion passed unanimously. Greg also reported the chapter had sent Charlie a thank you card.

Paul Lutz announced plans to move the chapter fly-out/camp out at Swank Field back to August. Tentative dates for this event are August 20-22 of 2021.

There was also discussion about having the chapter fly-in/pancake breakfast this year. The consensus was that May might be too early. The possibility of September was suggested so we could see how things are going with the Covid situation.

After Brian's update, Bob Taylor made a motion to have the chapter reimburse Brian up to \$200 for the cost of items not donated. The motion was seconded by Gary Baker.
