It's time to start spending some of the raffle money. The RedBird Simulator has been ordered, and delivery is expected in September, 2023. The current plan is to have RedBird set it up in the MLAA hangar. When AeroLab gets their new school building completed, the simulator will be moved to the new building. We are also ready to award some scholarships to deserving high school students. Our Scholarship Coordinator, Sara Hurley, and I interviewed seven students who had written essays as to why they should receive a scholarship. The good news here is, no matter who we select to receive a scholarship, we will have picked a deserving student. The first scholarship awarded will be for \$11,000 from the Ray Foundation. The second scholarship will be from our raffle funds, in the amount of \$10,000. We are also going to offer two additional \$5,000 scholarships from our raffle funds. These scholarships will be awarded to deserving high school students to complete their private pilot training within one year.

Robert Latham is working on a 50/50 grant request from Ray Foundation for the simulator. If successful, it would amount to around \$50,000! This additional money will allow us to offer some more scholarships. Let's hope it's successful.

EAA Announces Inaugural Learn to Fly Week - May 15 to 20

Aspiring aviators will have the opportunity to discover multiple pathways to becoming a pilot as EAA presents its inaugural Learn to Fly Week on May 15-20.

Beginning May 15th, expert flight instructors and representatives from various aviation organizations will present free, interactive webinars. These webinars will cover topics from starting flight training, saving time and money in flight training, preparing for the FAA written exam, to passing the checkride, and so much more. While the live showing of these presentations will be open to the public, the recordings will be archived for EAA members to view at their convenience.

Learn to Fly Week will conclude on Saturday, May 20, with Flying Start events hosted at chapters across the country. EAA's Flying Start program allows EAA chapters to welcome, encourage, and educate new aviation enthusiasts about the fun, freedom, and accessibility of personal aviation in their local area. Following a short presentation about learning to fly, attendees will be offered a free introductory Eagle Flight to experience the spirit of aviation firsthand. "Becoming a pilot is a dream for many, but few know where to start their journey. Learn to Fly Week was created to help encourage aspiring pilots to take action and begin the pilot training process," said David Leiting, EAA Eagles Program Manager. "Our goal is to show attendees how accessible achieving their dream actually is." 

Dale didn't like that prognosis and proceeded to find a study at NIH in DC that fit his situation. So, he got 10 years more of life rather than the 3 months originally projected.

He used those years to continue to live and fly, purchasing a Cub a while back and getting into back country flying. He also was enjoying his time motorcycling.

Dale was a gem cutter, jewelry maker, sculptor, pilot and a good friend.

I thought that the people with the chapter who remember him should hear about his passing.
