Flying OZ by Dan Marlenga

50 years ago a musical group called the Ozark Mountain Daredevils was formed in the Ozarks of north west Arkansas. On May 8th 2025 the Chapter 75 version of the Daredevils departed central Wisconsin to fly in the Ozark mountain region. This area is actually a large plateau with an elevation of just over 2500 feet. The lower elevations of this region allows us to fly in the mountains with still very good performance.

The group flying this adventure are Steve Krueger in his Rans-7, Paul Buss in his Avid Flyer, Lyle Banser in his Rans S6ES, and Dan Marlenga in his Rans S6ES. We departed our home bases at 7 am on May 8th and met up near the Stevens Point Airport. A discussion followed about our first gas stop in Savannah Illinois where we would face a strong 90 degree crosswind. It was decided to stop in Sauk Prairie to top off with gas and skip the unfavorable conditions in Savanna.

As luck would have it as we approached Savanna Steve reported he had a rough running engine and would stop at

Savanna to troubleshoot. Well we all decided to land in the very unfavorable 90 degree crosswind, and we all survived!

Steve and Paul worked on the Rotax 912S, adjusting Carbs and checking all possible areas. We all topped off with gas and Steve left first to see how she was running? We soon departed to get the call that Steve was still flying an unhappy airplane. He decided to turn back while he insisted we carry on to Arkansas.

We made our next stop in Mexico Missouri and took a factory tour of Zenith Aircraft. We got a tour with the founder's grandson, Cal Heintz. A really nice compact factory with about 8-12 employees. They put out parts for kits at a rate of around 1 kit every working day. Nice planes, would be a fine choice for your next project. We ran into town for a bite to eat at a nice family restaurant and departed for our planned day 1 overnight in Clinton Missouri.

There is a brand new terminal building at the Clinton airport. We used the airport courtesy car to drive to Lyle's family



vacation home on Truman Lake and spent the night there.

We got the report that Steve almost made it home, but had to make a precautionary landing in a field between Wausau and Merrill. With the help of his son Brian they taxied the S-7 down the road to Brian's house to begin more trouble-shooting.

We had tailwinds all day and 6.3 hours on the hobbs meter.

Day 2

This morning we departed Clinton and headed to Bentonville airport in NW Arkansas. This very nice field is situated below Class C airspace surrounded by 3 Class D airports. We fueled up our planes and our bodies and with careful navigation departed for our base camp.

We arrived at <u>Byrd's Adventure</u> <u>Center</u> in mid afternoon fighting heavy thermals and rotor winds off the mountains. On the Mullberry river, Byrd's is centrally located in the land of OZ, so in an hour and a half flight time you could reach the furthest Fly OZ airfields. We set



The May 17, 2025 meeting of UL Chapter 75 was called to order by President Steve Krueger at the Merrill Municipal Airport, New Terminal Building.

Self-introductions were done by 39 members in attendance. One plane, piloted by Dick Neitzel, flew in.

Secretary's report was read by

Cindy Hanig. Motion to accept made by Joe Malsack and seconded by Paul Buss. Motion carried. Thank you, Cindy, for filling in for Colleen.

Treasurer's report was read by

Lyle Banser. Lyle noted we earned 7 cents interest on the account. Thank you, Lyle, for filling in for Larry.

Old Business was discussed. First business was a reminder that anyone still needing to pay dues needed to see Lyle. Next, Paul Buss shared about Flying Oz, located in the Arkansas Ozarks. Paul had been studying this adventure since 2021. He stated that the Bentonville Airport has a Flying OZ guide available. OZ consists of 2 dozen airstrips, many privately owned. Permission is needed to land at some of the strips. He said this is not a trip you do yourself, you need to do this with a group. The team that formed to Fly OZ consisted of Dan Marlenga, Paul Buss, Banser, and Steve Krueger. It was noted that on May 7th, huge storms hit the Ozarks, but the grass strips did dry fast. All was going well with the trip until Savannah IIIinois. Then, Steve Krueger was having trouble with his Rotax engine. Steve made the decision to turn around and head back home. Paul, Dan, and Lyle persevered. The team of 3

stopped in Mexico, Missouri. While there, they toured the Zenith Aircraft factory. Zenith pumps out 1 new kit plane a day. The factory employs only 6-8 people. Accommodations for the night were at the famous Banser resort in Clinton Missouri.

The Bentonville Airport is the HQ for the Ozark airstrips. The pilots were informed many strips are privately maintained as well, so one needed to make sure to clean up any garbage. Paul shared that the Recreational Aviation Foundation, known as RAF, which is out of Montana, volunteer's hours and manpower to protect airports from disappearing. The RAF is involved in maintaining some OZ airstrips. RAF is always looking for volunteers to clear trees, cut back brush, etc.
