Airspace Report – Jim Timm



- A controller at FFZ has tested positive for Covid-19. As a result, staffing and hours of operation have been reduced. New hours are 6:15a until 3:45p through at least July 3
- The newly paved Coolidge runway 5/23 is now open and is way nice
- **As always**, check Notams before flying.
 - Fire season is in full swing – watch for those pesky TFRs



Accident Report – Todd Bristol



- Date and Time of Accident: 6/2/2020, 1930MST
- Type of Plane Involved: Symphony OMF 100
- Location of Accident: Glendale Airport, GEU
- Occupants/Injuries: Two, No Injuries.
- Accident: Two Pilots were taking turns doing Touch and goes. Following a normal touchdown, the pilot heard a loud thud and the airplane veered to the right. He applied left aileron and left rudder to return the airplane to the runway center. However, after the pilot subsequently applied brake pressure, the airplane rapidly departed the right runway edge, the right main landing gear collapsed, and the airplane came to rest. According to the occupants, none of their previous touch downs were hard.
- Damage: Substantial Damage to the right Horizontal stabilizer. The right main landing gear separated at the gear leg root and several structural tubes had failed.
- Contributing Factors: none
- Probable Cause of Accident: Unknown but possible Over correction
- Lesson Learned: Preflight May Have Caught Crack In Landing Gear?

Additional June Accidents

NO NTSB Details Yet

- **June 9** about 8:00a an RV-4 crashed approaching Safford airport to land. He had departed Tucson and there are no details available regarding the accident other than the pilot was killed and airplane destroyed.
- **June 9** about 8:00 pm a Zodiac CH60 HDS crashed near Ak Chin airport. Pilot had departed DVT for AK Chin (A39) for fuel. On departure from A39, the airplane struck the very top of a mountain (hill) about 2 miles northeast of the airport. The pilot was killed and the aircraft burned. About 10 foot more altitude, and he would have been safe. The pilot had inherited the airplane from his father, who had built it. It was powered by a Hirth 2 cycle engine (roughly 60hp).
- June 16, about 8p a Cessna P210 made a gear up landing at Ak Chin airport. Only the airplane (and the pilots pride) got hurt
