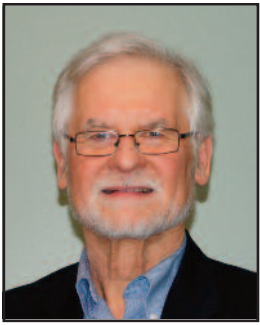
"EAA Chapter 113's major focus is on the relationships with people who have diverse aviation interests, centered around their love of flight, fellowship, learning, and fun."

Runway 18 Noise Abatement Procedures

Departing Runway 18

Climb upwind on a **145° heading** avoiding subdivision

Maximum rate of climb to Traffic Pattern Altitude (TPA) 1,700 ft.

Reduce power as soon as practical

NO right turns from pattern until above TPA or Air Traffic Control requires it.

STUDENT PILOTS

Climb on runway heading to 500 AGL (1200 MSL) before turning crosswind

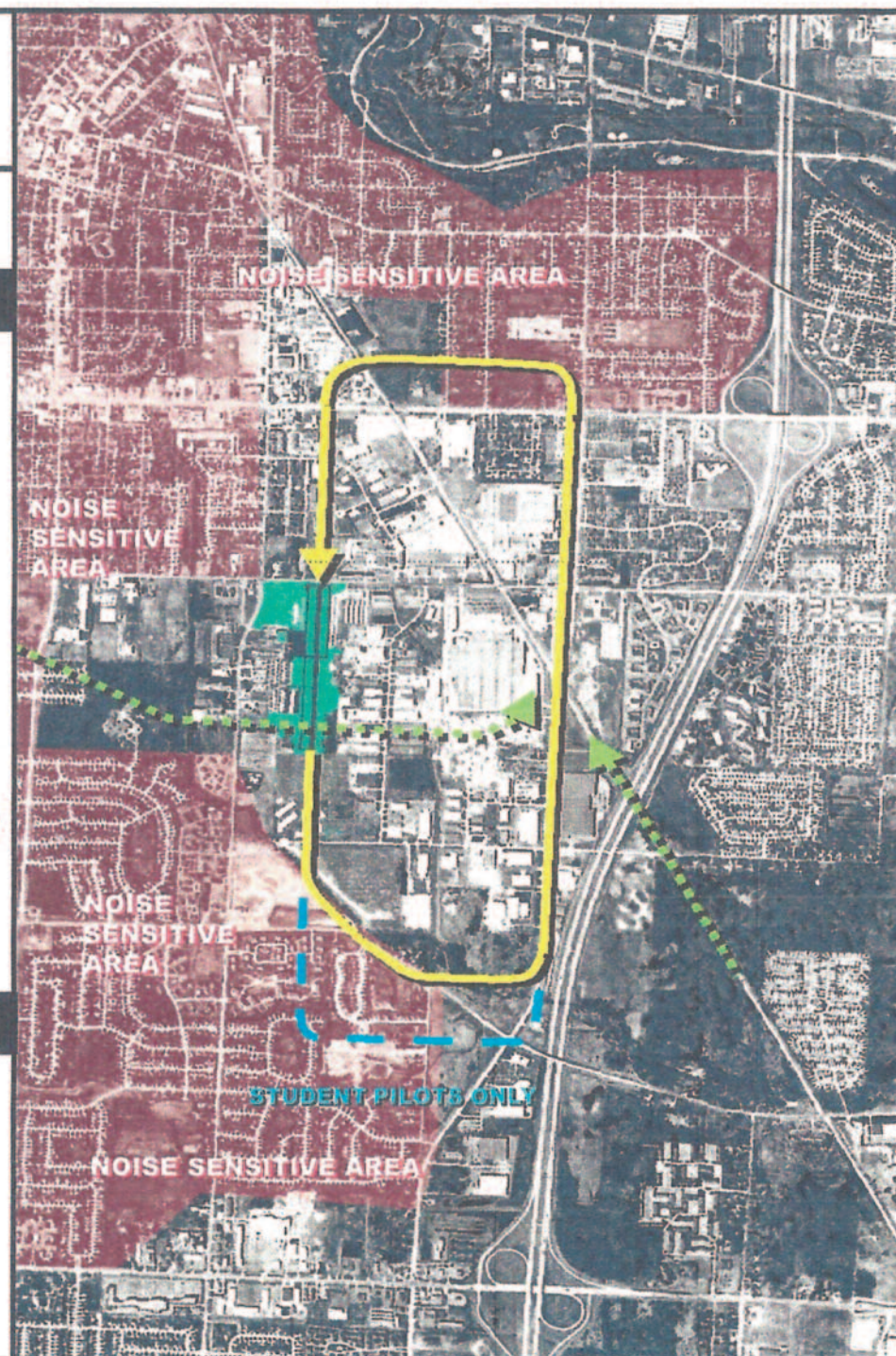
TOUCH AND GOES PROHIBITED

Arriving Runway 18

From west of airport: Join a midfield crosswind at or above Traffic Pattern Altitude (TPA)

BE ALERT FOR DEPARTING TRAFFIC

Canton-Plymouth-Mettetal Airport

Runway 36 Noise Abatement Procedures

Departing Runway 36

Climb runway heading for 2 miles

DO NOT turn over city or subdivisions

Maximum rate of climb to Traffic Pattern Altitude (TPA) 1,700 ft.

Reduce power as soon as practical

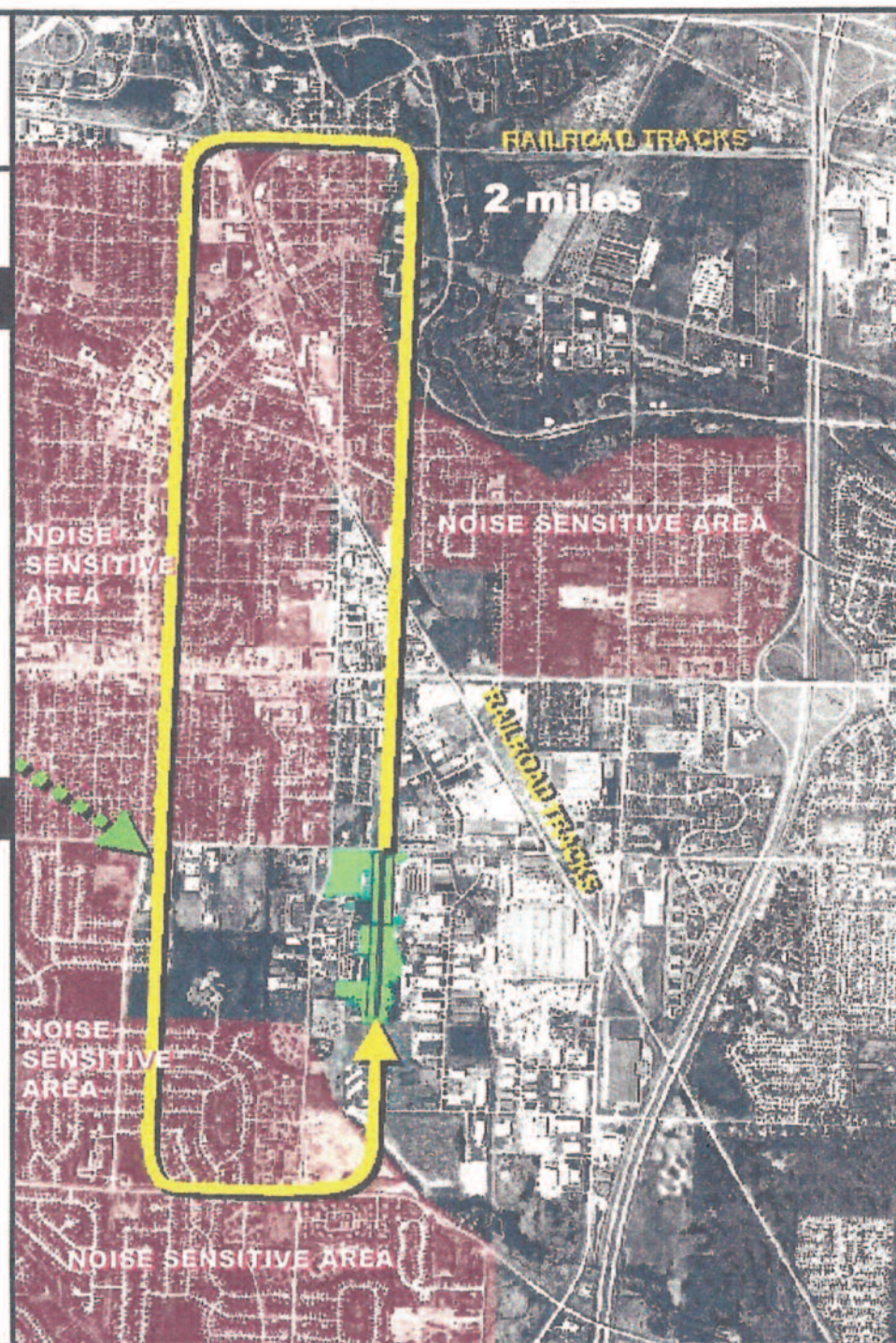
TOUCH AND GOES PROHIBITED

Arriving Runway 36

BE ALERT FOR TRAFFIC in the pattern well north of the airport

BE ALERT FOR TRAFFIC not following noise abatement procedures

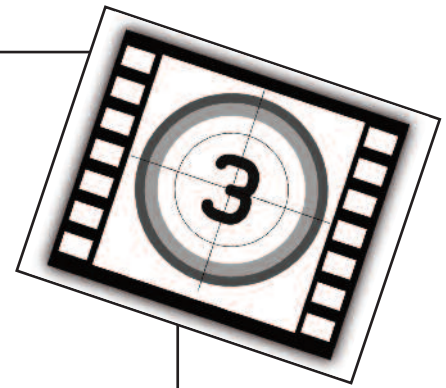
