Astronaut Michael Collins to Highlight Apollo-11 50th Anniversary at AirVenture 2019

Apollo 11 command module pilot Michael Collins will be the featured guest as EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2019 commemorates the 50th anniversary of the Apollo 11 mission, which in July 1969 marked the first time men landed on the moon and returned safely.

Collins will be will be joined by fellow Apollo astronaut Joe Engle during the evening program at Theater in the Woods on Friday, July 26, hosted by four-time space shuttle astronaut Charlie Precourt. The program will highlight the millions of man-hours and hundreds of thousands of people who made the first manned moon landing possible.

"Even a half-century later, the Apollo 11 mission stands as one of the great human achievements of all time," said Rick Larsen, EAA's vice president of communities and member programs, who coordinates AirVenture features and attractions. "We are



honored to have Michael Collins, Joe Engle, and others take us back to the memorable 'one giant leap for mankind.' We know this will be a hugely popular evening program that will make EAA AirVenture 2019 even more of a must-attend event."

Collins, mission commander Neil Armstrong, and lunar module pilot Buzz Aldrin departed then-Cape Kennedy, Florida, on July 16, 1969, as the famed Saturn V rocket lifted the trio into space. On July 20, the lunar module landed on the moon's surface, with the first human steps by Armstrong and Aldrin on the surface a few hours later. Apollo 11 made a successful splashdown in the Pacific Ocean on July 24, 1969.

Collins' NASA career began in 1963 as part of the third group of astronauts selected. His first space flight was aboard the Gemini 10 mission with John Young in 1966, when Collins became America's third spacewalker. Prior to his career at NASA, he earned his college degree at West Point and built flight time in U.S. Air Force F-86 Sabres at Nellis Air Force Base in Nevada, as well as serving at George Air Force Base and Edwards Air Force Base in California.

After leaving NASA in 1970, Collins joined the Smithsonian Institution for 10 years, serving for seven years as director of the Smithsonian's National Air and Space Museum. He has also written numerous books, including 1974's Carrying the Fire, highlighting his time in the space program.

The Fray, which has spent the last 15 years on the Top 100 charts, will bring its pop/rock sounds to EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2019 as the featured performer at the annual opening night concert presented by Ford



Motor Company on Monday, July 22 — the official kickoff day to the 50th anniversary celebration of AirVenture in Oshkosh. <u>The Fray</u> will be joined by Animal Years for the concert held on Boeing Plaza immediately after the AirVenture afternoon air show that day.

During the break between bands, Ford will highlight its "Ford Day" activities by unveiling the 2019 vehicle to be auctioned at EAA's The Gathering fundraiser on July 25. "We're really excited for the second annual Ford Day to open AirVenture and what better way to top off the day than with a concert featuring The Fray," said Michael Sprague, Ford Motor Company director, brand & integrated marketing.

The Fray's album, *Through the Years: The Best of The Fray*, includes the band's biggest hits, including the smash "How to Save a Life," which spent more than a year on the Billboard Hot 100 chart, and "Over My Head (Cable Car)" as well as the single "Singing Low." The Denver-based band has won multiple Billboard Music Awards and earned several Grammy nominations.

Animal Years was named a "Band to Watch" by *Rolling Stone* magazine in December 2017. The band's mix of pop, rock, and Americana appeals to audiences across the musical spectrum. Its live performances follow the philosophy of the band's name as explained by founding member Mike McFadden, to "live your life in animal years. ... If you knew that you'd only be around for a few years, you'd do things differently."

"This is the 14th year that Ford Motor Company has helped us kick off AirVenture with an opening-night concert that has brought hit makers from across the musical spectrum to Oshkosh," said Rick Larsen, EAA's

vice president of communities and member programs, who coordinates AirVenture features and attractions. "From the Beach Boys and the Doobie Brothers to Dierks Bentley and Dustin Lynch, it's been a great way to start an unforgettable week. The Fray and Animal Years will add to those memories in 2019."

Other highlighted features planned for EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2019 include the 50th anniversaries of the Apollo 11 moon mission and the Boeing 747 jetliner, the Year of the Fighter with vintage and modern military aircraft, the Urban Air Mobility showcase, and much more. Additional information on other AirVenture events will be announced as it is finalized.

Young Eagles Co-Chairman Sean D. Tucker and Team Oracle this week announced that Jessy Panzer is joining the air show formation act that is debuting this year at air shows throughout the country, including EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2019.

"Jessy is as reverent to the demands, the art form, and the discipline required for aerobatic flight as anyone else I've seen," Tucker said. "I'm thrilled to fly with Jessy and share the magic of



flight as a team with millions of fans this year. This season is truly one fans won't want to miss. It will be a farewell to the Oracle Challenger III before it heads to the National Air and Space Museum for the 'We All Fly' gallery opening in 2021, plus it's an awe-inspiring debut as a team. We've been working with coach and master of flight Bill Stein to put together a one-of-a-kind performance."

Panzer is a graduate of Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University and a certified flight instructor in airplanes, rotorcraft, and seaplanes. She began flying aerobatics in 2000 and in 2012 joined the U.S. Advanced Aerobatic Team. She flew her first air show in Fairmont, Nebraska, the site for the 2003 Nebraska State Fly-In. In 2004, she qualified in the Formula One Class to race at the Reno National Championship Air Races. Panzer's path first crossed with Tucker and Stein in 2005 when she was invited to be mentored by the two along with Wayne Handley on the Stars of Tomorrow Aerobatic Flight Team. Panzer will fly the Oracle Extra 300L alongside Sean D. Tucker's Oracle Challenger III.

"When I'm flying aerobatics, I am in tune with the universe," Panzer said. "It's an honor to fly aerobatics and I am so humbled to fly alongside and under the mentorship of Sean Tucker. He's been an inspiration to me ever since I began my career in flying."

The Team Oracle Performance begins in close formation action with Panzer flying the Oracle Extra 300L off the wing of Tucker's Oracle Challenger III. Then the chase ensues with a loop and a clover down split into opposing solos. Tucker, in front, thrills the audience with signature maneuvers such as the centrifuge, an insideoutside loop, Tucker-Upper, and snap and torque rolls. Simultaneously dancing in the sky, Panzer delights with the hammerhead, avalanche, Immelmann, and other breath-taking maneuvers. The team then rejoins in a torque circle for some close formation work before a charming speedo heart departure.

EAA Chapter 382 gathered on Thursday, March 21st, at Chapter member Chris Shearer's home shop in Beavercreek Ohio where he and his father are restoring a 1946 Taylorcraft BC12D.

Chris is an Aeronautical Engineer and his father is retired from Kent State University as their Choir Director. Both are pilots. Ironically it was the shared hobby of building model airplanes when Chris was young, which grew into a lifelong love for airplanes for both.

Through the evening Chris covered several aspects of their restoration project.

1) The ailerons that we just completed covering.

- 2) How we made new spars, new ribs, and new tip bows for the ailerons
- 3) The similar process of going through with the wings, except they were able to reuse the existing ribs
- 4) Corrosion protection and lack there of in the original aircraft. Steel to Aluminum, wood rot, etc
- 5) Incorrect manufacturing techniques used in the factory





He also showed us his CNC machine and talked about the learning process and how it has made the production of replacement parts easier to make. They also shared some stories of things they discovered about the Taylorcraft airplane when it was uncovered. Among them was a bird's nest that was hiding in one of the wing struts. It can be seen in one of the photographs.

A red light bulb over the door caught the attention of some. When asked what its purpose was it was revealed to be a "Wife light", since much of the work was noisy a red light was installed with a switch in the house for his wife to let him know when she needed him. His father was also adding in with several points throughout the meeting. They make quite a team.

They didn't seem to be on a schedule per se, just a father and son enjoying the challenges of airplane restoration together.





Colonel Tom Moe of Fairfield County will give the keynote address. Colonel Moe, who was a Silver Star recipient in the US Air Force, was a Vietnam POW.

The Historical Aircraft Squadron (HAS) will also have its military aircraft and vehicles on display. HAS is an all-volunteer, non-profit organization dedicated to the restoration, display and operation of former military aircraft and related equipment. Its hangar/museum is located at the Fairfield County Airport.

"I'm really excited for the Anniversary Celebration," said Kip Kelsey, member of HAS and one of the event planners. "We haven't had an air show or a major event at the airport since 2008. This will be a spectacular family-friendly event for all of those that miss the air show. It will also give people a chance to see the HAS museum and what's sitting right in their backyard."

Having another plain-Jane RV was not enough for Mike though. He wanted her to look better.

So....the wrap which is vinyl was done by Jeff Cloud in Marianna, FL. My basic white RV6 is one of the first

pics. This is a 2005 RV 6 with 1000 hours total time I purchased this yr hoping to wrap as a military trainer or at the most as a 1942 AVG p-40 warhawk from Col ChenaultsAMerican Volunteer group that was established in China at least two yrs before the US entered the War.

The stars and the insignias are from after they lost their Chinese Star and became part of the US Army Air Corp.

The design was done on computer and then Jeff Cloud spent almost 3 weeks with very little help completing the transfer to what she looks like now. Special detail was done thru out the process from exhaust to guns to special art inside the cockpit aft wall. For shows and groups I also have the flight gear with patches etc that match the units in 1942.



I specifically looked for a RV 6 so I could take kids and adults alike to experience the 3 dimensional world we pilots live in, including its ability for aerobatics, and with pax side by side instead of guest behind me where its hard to monitor their reactions and communicate.

At fuel burn of around 8 gal an hour I hope to enjoy many wonderful experiences sharing history and the joy of flying.



I learned to fly at Bolton Field, used to ride my bike from Grove City to beg for rides as a kid, Got all my licenses from there, later I was an instructor at Air Columbus and a line boy, also Graduated Ohio State University.

I started my own charter business (Columbus Business Charter), joined the Air Force Reserves as a WSO in F-4 Ds with the 89th TFS at Wright Pat, worked, for EJA, joined the Army nat Guard later as a Huey Pilot then transferrd to the Army reserves as HHC commander Aviation MX officer.

I later Flew Gulfstream IVs and Hawkers for The Limited Stores for 10 yrs and then was hired on at Continental Airlines as a DC 10 Flight Engineer, then as a pilot with United on the 737 where I have been for 20 yrs, 12 years as a Captain.
