### Homebuilding at its Best!

The list of building materials for the project reads more like a honey-do list around the house than an aircraft project. Art is quite the craftsman, so he worked with a number of materials in the development of the aircraft. Cardboard, plastic, bondo body filler, paper mache, fiberglass, and a waste basket (yes, a waste basket).

Art spent approximately 152 hours building the project over the past 10 months, but admits that the trial and error method of design added time.

The fuselage is wood and the wings

Art set up a paint booth in his garage and sprayed two coats of exterior primer, two coats of latex white gloss exterior paint and trimmed it with burgundy accents.



- We made a difference to a paraplegic (and his pastor and many of his congregation) by providing his first flight and letting him check off an item on his bucket list.
- We made a difference for dozens and dozens of kids (and Jeremy Casey) by letting them sit in Art Sweeten's beautiful micro-mini plane, get their pictures taken, and forget about how long they might be waiting for a flight. (We need to make a difference to Art and reimburse the cost of materials, too...)
- If you missed the last meeting, you might not know we wrote Marty Flournoy a check to help make a small difference in the expenses he will incur when he competes in the World Advanced Aerobatic Championships in Hungary next month.

Many of the things we do to make a difference are paid for by funds raised during the air show. But we couldn't front the expenses for the air show without the dues you all pay to be active members. We couldn't cover our insurance, our fees to the state, or the cost of our post office box without dues. Fixing up Hangar 13 will mean more people have to dig into their own pockets if we don't all pay our dues.

It's up to you, really. We don't keep people from coming to the meetings and we don't refuse to send them this newsletter if they don't pay dues. Heck, there's no decoder ring or special hat if you DO pay your dues. I only want you to pay your dues if being a part of what we do – if supporting the things we support – is worth paying for. (We're working on the decoder ring for next year...)

I'll make you a deal: If being a member of EAA 677 *IS* worth paying for – for June only – you can simply pay what its worth to you. Come to the meeting and pay or just mail a check to EAA 677, P.O. Box 325, Columbus, GA 31902 and tell us that's what being a part of all this is worth to you. I won't look at anything on the check except your name so we can mark you paid-in-full for 2012.

If you've already paid, and many have, thank you. If you don't pay in June, we go back to our regular dues structure (new this year) of \$40 for full membership if paid in the first quarter, \$30 in Q2, \$20 in Q3 and \$10 if you wait for October. Seniors 65 and older also get a pro-rated deal, but start at \$20, and students are \$10 no matter what.

So think about it. I know there are SOME things you'll pay for just because they're worth it. What's EAA 677 worth to you?


