

Liability Protection For Airstrip Owners

On March 11th the Georgia House approved the Senate changes to HB494, which was amended in February to include the RUS amendment language from Senate Bill 127. HB494 was overwhelmingly adopted as amended and now goes to the Governor's office for signature!

HB494 includes provisions to amend Georgia's Recreational Use Statute to provide liability protection for airstrip owners who choose to let others use their facilities and to provide a means by which airstrip owners can have safety

markers installed on above ground utility lines that are within the approach to landing of airstrips.

Amazing Program-Landing On An Aircraft Carrier

Our guest speaker at our Saturday morning Program on April 5th, is Stan Jessen. Stan graduated from California Polytechnic State University (Cal Poly) in San Luis Obispo with degrees in Aeronautical Engineering and Mathematics. After graduation, Stan worked at Boeing, Seattle, for two years as a flight test operations engineer on the 737 and 747 flight test programs. He left Boeing to join the US Navy where he spend 9 years as a Naval Aviator, flying T34, T2, TA4 and A7 aircraft. While in the Navy he taught: instruments, tactics (bombing, ACM [air combat maneuvering-- better known as dog fighting], low level flying, and carrier landings). Stan flew the A7 attack aircraft while assigned to the VA195 Dam-busters. His squadron deployed aboard the USS Kitty Hawk where he was quali-

fied for all missions including nuclear delivery. His last Navy assignment was as a TA4 adversary pilot trained to act as an opposing force in war games. After leaving the Navy, Stan moved to Atlanta where he worked in the technology industries for the past 30+ years. He currently lives in Cumming with his wife Linda. He is "mostly retired" and has two grown children.

Some of the topics that Stan will be covering include: Aircraft Carrier Features, Carrier Aircraft Features, Flight Operations, Pilot Training and so much more.

Stan is sure to have an amazing story to tell so be sure to join us for a very interesting program. As always, please join us prior to the program for a delicious Pancake Breakfast. The breakfast is served

from 8:00-10:30. The program starts at 10:30.
