Originally designed in 1930, our Pietenpol was built in 2010 and was built with a steel tube fuselage instead of wood. It is slightly wider and longer than a standard Piet. Bernie Pietenpol was the first homebuilder to install a Corvair engine in an experimental aircraft in 1960. Now many Pietenpols fly with Corvair power plants...including ours.
