- The feature of this month's meeting was a presentation by Dave Sternberg about the new **Basic Med** option allowed by the FAA. - Jen Jacob presents our first **Young Eagles rally of the season:**

### Other news:

- Carolyn Haley is working with John Wood of the FAA to present his “Winter Operations” talk, a **WINGS Program**, on Saturday, November 4, 9:00 to 11:00 a.m. Pencil in the date for now, as we have to wait until August for a solid confirmation.
- No update on the **Leaf-Peeper Fly-In** for this month. The October 14 date is firm, and an organization committee will be formed in July to pull everything together.
- Jen Jacob from the **Sip 'n Dip** committee reports: “The idea of this came about last year when we were talking about how fun it would be to fly around the state to several airports—including all the EAA chapter homes—and meet people while snacking. While Sip 'n Dips usually involve wine and hors d'oeuvres, since we are flying, obviously this would not involve wine. However, we were thinking we could suggest other beverages. At this point, the committee has identified a possible route involving six airports, primarily on the east side of Vermont. Our tentative date is June 24, and the next steps for the committee are to contact each sponsor and determine the menu and timing. Stay tuned!”

- Gary Joseph gave us a brief *treasurer's report* for the quarter just ended. As he reported previously, we're all paid up with annual expenses such as EAA National dues and insurance, and donation to EAA's Peter Burgher Fund. Gary also reiterated the need to inventory and evaluate our hard-goods assets, i.e., the furniture and space in hangar B that comprise a pilot's lounge and supply closets. We also need to start thinking about ways to invest our capital in any tools, equipment, or other items of specialized use to the chapter now and in the future. Let's discuss this at next meeting.
- Spinning off from this topic, Jennifer Jacob reported on a new workspace in Rutland available for build projects: Makerspace. This is a *shared workshop* being developed by Rutland economic development groups and local schools, and will provide inexpensive work areas and equipment for metalworking, woodworking, and electronics. More information will be provided as it comes available.
- Another responsibility that needs to be addressed is inspecting the *Lisa Fall Campground*, to make sure it's ready for anyone to use. We are looking for work party volunteers to attend to this. E-mail your interest and availability to [EAA968@vermontel.net](mailto:EAA968@vermontel.net) or come to the next meeting and help round up a group.
- Two major *runway improvements* will be occurring this summer, at Rutland (KRUT) and Middlebury (6B0) airports. At KRUT, construction will be starting in May and running into September, first with groundwork at the northern end of runway 1-19 for preparation of construction for the new taxiway A alongside it. The peak work will occur in July, with two multi-day closures of runway 1-19 in mid to late July when there will be 24-hour work activity. Runway 13-31 will remain open. The actual construction of taxiway A will commence in 2018.

Meanwhile, the runway at 6B0 will fully close starting April 24 to widen and lengthen the runway. Work will start on the north end and construction will be done in three installments. The planned construction window for the runway is 60 days but the contractor is aiming for 45 days and everyone is crossing their fingers. After the runway construction is done, work will commence on rebuilding the taxiway, during which time the improved runway will be open. There will be a grand reopening celebration when all is done. Many Middlebury-based folks will be moving their planes to Rutland, giving us fresh faces to welcome.

Information on the Middlebury closure was presented on Saturday, April 8, at a fly-in breakfast held at 6B0. Unfortunately, the weather made flying unfeasible, but there was plenty to do on the ground. 6B0 staff and volunteers hosted a fine feed, and Dr. Dave Bahnson gave a fascinating WINGS Program on the effects of sleep deprivation on the body. Chapter 968 was represented at the meeting by Carolyn Haley, Charlie North, Jeff Stewart, and Mike Petralia.

- With our own events on the horizon, we will be incurring expenses, so we need to earn some income to offset them. Discussions are in process among different parties about event-specific and general chapter shirts to sell; take a look at our current *chapter apparel* inventory (photos on page 8-9), and be ready at the next meeting to talk about what's desired and appropriate for the group.

Remember, too, that a portion of the chapter's annual income comes from **memberships**. If you haven't renewed yet, please do so.

To be an EAA chapter member, you must also belong to EAA National. Their dues are \$40/year. Any new chapter member not already a member of EAA is eligible for a complimentary six-month trial membership to EAA National upon joining the chapter.
