Have you heard?

A British Airways A320 was hit by what most likely was a drone as it prepared to land at London's Heathrow Airport on Sunday 17 of April. Police said the pilot of the BA flight from Geneva had reported that he believed a drone had struck the aircraft before it landed safely.

Commenting on the latest incident, the British Airlines Pilots Association said that more education for drone users and stronger enforcement of the rules around drones were needed to keep aircraft safe.

Controllers, like to meet pilots as well. This year, our EAA chapter will be making 2 trips to ATC in Burlington. The first will be Wednesday May 18th. If you cannot get off work during the week, you won't have to miss out. Our second trip north to the tower will be on a Saturday later in the summer. Some of you may know that the Air National Guard (ANG) offered an open house in the afternoon of April 8th. This was specifically for the general aviation community and involved getting up close and personal with the F16's and other aircraft, receiving a "briefing" on MOA and other military airspace, and an opportunity to "fly" one of their many simulators. The guard also provided tasty food from the grill.

This well organized event was not only very informative but great fun. The GA community was well represented, although, as you might imagine, the weekday 3:00 to 5:00 pm time slot prevented many from attending. The ANG staff was welcoming and enthusiastic, making themselves available for chit chat with everyone. Several military pilots fly GA aircraft. This was particularly helpful during the briefing lecture about airspace.

The myth that military aircraft will see small piston planes flying through an MOA was soberingly dispelled. Other valuable information was discussed:

- military routes (you know, those narrow grey/black lines labeled VR # or IR # on sectionals),
- what the military training in an MOA involves and why we might not be seen
- how you can get accurate military airspace activity information (Flight Service is not always in the know).

I am sure each visitor had their favorite event activity. Mine was the simulator. I was initially worried about my tendency toward nausea in this responsive "aircraft". But flying is flying. Taking off at KBTV and finding myself in northern NY at 15000' traveling 500 knots in a matter of seconds was pretty fun. The simulator can provide a 360 view. Fortunately for me, G-forces were not a part of this experience. The visual of rapid climbs, descents and turns was challenging enough for my vestibular system. I was my usual cautious pilot self and first in my group of 6 GA pilots to fly the simulator. Others were more adventurous doing dogfight type maneuvers.

All in all, a very satisfying afternoon. While the simulator cannot come to KRUT, the ANG can. The message we all heard was that the Burlington ANG is wanting to be more open with the local community. I am hoping to have ANG representatives come to talk to our Chapter in July or August. We will discuss this at our next meeting on May 3rd.

The specific ETA at KBTV will be determined at the May 3rd Chapter meeting. If you want to join us on May 18th please let Gail know sooner than later. The folks at ATC are happy to welcome a large group. They just want to have an idea of how many to expect.
