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Maximum Maneuvering Speed

Some people do not know what the significance of *Max. Maneuvering Speed* or *Design Maneuvering Speed* is. Each airplane is different depending on the "G" loads it is designed for but in all cases it is the speed, or lower, where the airplane will stall before the design maximum load is achieved by the aircraft. At low gross weights it will take a higher "G" load (gust or pull-up) than at high gross

weights. In other words, the design maneuvering speed for the SeaRey is 85 miles per hour and any pull up below this speed, regardless of the gross weight, the aircraft will stall and will not exceed the structural strength of the airplane, in particular the wings. So in practice when the weather has severe gusts or severe rough weather keep the speed below 85 miles per hour in the SeaRey and the airplane

may stall, but you won't rip off the wings. Also if you like to show off and do pull ups, do so at a speed below the design maneuvering speed and you wont wrinkle the wings. Of course this assumes that the engineering of the plane was done correctly.

Conclusion: Learn the Maximum Maneuvering speed of your airplane. It may save your life some day.

Barbeque and Macadamia nut cookies supplied, bring a dish to pass. 850' N/S landing strip, 1/4 mile west of shop (clear to south only) 44 56 33N 90 19 56W

Land to the NORTH, take off to the SOUTH. Please note obstacles, 20' tall pine tree line, 100' east of strip, buildings and 30' power lines to the north, 30' power lines and freeway entrance ramp 1000' to west.

EXTEND YOUR GLIDE PAST A GENTLE E/ W SWALE 150'NORTH OF SOUTH END MARKED WITH PLASTIC RIBBON.

We also have a 400' diameter round field for Powered parachutes and a 1500' NW/SE strip clear to SE only. 1500' strip is not as smooth as N/S strip. SEE SWALE NOTE ABOVE Hey all: Just so you can mark this day off on your calendar. The boulder Junction Musky Day Fly-In for the coming year is Sunday, August 12, 2001. This past fly-in was a big one and we expect next year to be even bigger.
