We ask, please do not go to catering extremes, we are happy with Kool-Aid and Cookies...



Frank "Woof" Beagle, 69, of Kankakee, passed away peacefully Sunday (May 12, 2013) at his home. Frank was born Nov. 27, 1943, in Portland, Ore. He served in the U.S. Navy from 1962 through 1966 married Nancy Kaitschuk (she survives) on July 9, 1977. He was a technician at Copier Dynamics for 25 years, retiring in 2011. Frank was a proud and active sport flying enthusiast. He led ultralight aircraft safety seminars throughout the Mid-



west and served as chairman of, and announcer for the ultralight field at "AirVenture," the Oshkosh air show for 25 years. His announcing was peppered with commentary from his

vast knowledge of all aircraft and related technologies and his writing could be found in several sport aircraft publications. Frank was known for his resonant, booming voice and robust laugh. He was a member of Local EAA Chapter 990.


