Paul Poberezny 1921-2013

Paul Poberezny came from humble beginnings, yet he created one of the world largest aviation

organizations and emerged as one of the 20th century's greatest aviation leaders, creating worldwide aviation organization and the world's largest annual fly -in event, EAA AirVenture Oshkosh. Wisconsin.

died He on 🗾 August 22, 2013, in Oshkosh after career that spanned more than 70 years of flight at the controls of more than 5 0 0 different types of aircraft.

Paul is survived his wife, by Audrey; one son, Tom (Sharon)

Poberezny of Brookfield, Wisconsin; one daughter, Bonnie (Chuck) Parnall of Oshkosh; t w o granddaughters, Audra (Michael) Hoy of Oshkosh and Lesley Poberezny of Brookfield, Wisconsin; and one great-granddaughter born in 2012, Charlotte "Charley" Hoy.

Paul Poberezny often said In January that there was not a day that went by that he didn't say the word "airplane."

"You can't be a success if you don't love people." reaches

His flight experiences began as a high school student and continued through service in World War II and the Korean conflict. Between the wars, he began his hands-on approach to aircraft design and building that would direct his future and his legacy.
