# Editorial Notes by Rich Prange

The last time I saw a carbon arc search light in operation was at

a Clark gas station "grand o I've forgotten something can opening". When is the last time you saw a Clark station? This o fuel store was not trying to track enemy aircraft; they wanted to attract curious drivers. After following the extremely brilliant shaft of light the assumption was - "Fill'er up." When is the last time you bought gasoline at 32 cents per gallon?


# Next NCWLF Meeting July 8
