Looking for an interesting destionce-in-a-life-time nation, event? August 21 will bring a solar eclipse to North America tracking from near Portland, OR, eastward to Charleston, NC. For Central Wisconsin pilots the closest town in the umbra path (shadow of the eclipse) would be Lathrop, KS, 507 miles. Do they have an airport?

For the total eclipse experience, a slightly longer flight, Makanda, IL, is the spot to be. This tiny scenic town in Southern IL is dead center in that 70 mile wide umbra path and will remain darkened longer than any spot in North America. Supposedly one of the few rooms for rent has been booked for \$3,800. Pricy for that neighborhood and what if it is an overcast day? So what? You could get a rain check redeemable in 2024, same place. Yes, another eclipse. What are the odds? Be alert for GPS interference.

Seaplane Base 2017

My intent was to write a day by day journal of the activities and traffic in and out of the seaplane base down at Black Wolf Creek - Oshkosh. Upon my arrival and setting up my truck camper for the week, the preparation routine felt comfortable and normal. After greetings to old friends, the hard work of getting ready began.

Mid-morning Tuesday, wheels fell off the bus. A strong disagreement about seaplane base policy, between Jack Pelton, EAA CEO, and Chairman Paul Seehafer and Vice Chairman Ann Seehafer came to a head. Without having much detail at this time I write in support of Paul and Ann; they have done an amazing job of coordinating and organizing seaplane base activities and business.

Then came Thursday, a Lake Renegade flown by a Marshal, MN, pilot crashed, resulting in Here We Go the death of himself and a passenger. I will write openly about what I witnessed.

This crash was totally unneceswas not an accident. The piair operation, and a ride out green. into the bay to check wind and



wave conditions. The advice escalated into a discussion about authority, at which point Tom Leahe of air operations disengaged. After topping off to 70 gallons of fuel the pilot made the decision to take off in two foot choppy waves in a low wing amphibious aircraft.

I am impressed and proud of the professional skill shown by our seaplane base rescue team; I had never seen their practice drill. From the alarm signal to loaded and on the move was less than two minutes, then at the crash site within 5-6 minutes. My job was to drive a pontoon boat to hopefully bring back survivors.

Faulty judgment cost two lives and put our rescue team at risk. One of the seaplane base divers had a bad cut and suffered chemical burns from the aviation fuel in the water. Two news stories indicated the seaplane base assisted with the rescue; they were the rescue!
