Remember this airmail postage stamp? Back in 2014 some-



thing I read about airmail routes, the planes and pilots, navigation etc. piqued my curiosity. So I dipped into a bit of aviation history. This 5 cent



airmail stamp answered part of my questions.

Back in the day, compass and dead reckoning were the skills needed to deliver mail by airplane. In 1928, the USPD solicited funds for a trail of navigation markers from New York to San Francisco. Some markers torches were acetylene mounted on steel towers, some markers were 50 ft cement slabs in the shape of an (painted yellow), or arrow both.

All of these navigation markers quickly became obsolete as flying technology evolved. The steel towers were repurposed and most of the cement slabs yielded to farming and other forms of development. I found one! Yup, right on the edge of a corn field on German Rd. just out of the town of Steward IL.

The Steward postmistress had heard of the marker but never




seen it. After knocking on two farmhouse doors, my quest was a satisfied. This arrow, yellow paint long faded away, at one time also included the (Continued on page 3)

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
