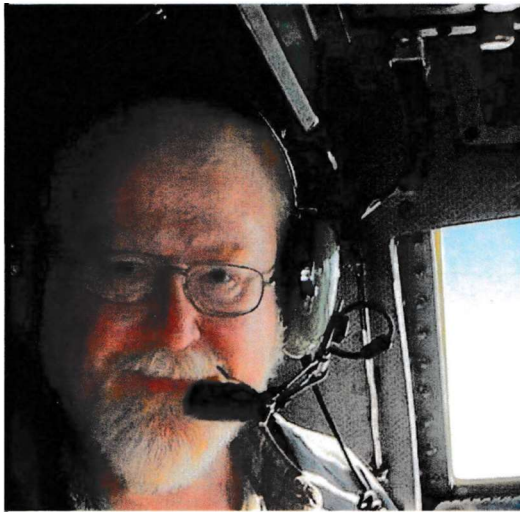

TERRY LUNDBY - 2022



Terry Lundby grew up in Fertile, MN. He has always had an interest in aviation. He earned his private pilot license at the age of 17. Terry combined his love of aviation with his artistic talent. His first piece of art, At the age of twenty-five, was a rendition of a Spitfire on card stock, using model airplane paints.

He later met his mentor, Harvey Schroeder, an artist, and teacher in Elk River. He taught Terry the importance of the visual effect over that of the subject.

"I paint in oils, on canvas striving to accurately depict the subject without losing the artistic quality in needless detail. I am not a "rivet counter". In fact, the aircraft or subject of the painting is secondary to my goal of a stunning visual effect. A visual effect such as the underside of an A-6 Intruder being illuminated by light reflected from the ocean below, the feeling of height of an OV-10 Bronco over rice paddies or the transparent windscreen of an F-4 Phantom made opaque by the sun's rays."

Terry's art is displayed on four continents. Both commissions and prints. He has won the prestigious Experimental Aircraft Association's Par Excellence Award in addition to displaying his art at the Air Venture Museum in Oshkosh Wisconsin on numerous occasions.

His paintings have also been displayed at the Simu-flight facility in Dallas Texas. His work has also appeared in both Flying and Sport Aviation magazines. He is currently in the process of building a Milholland Legal Eagle airplane.
