"The camp director decided to add the Sport Air workshops as part of the 16 to 19 age group program. They do the standard sheet metal and composites course. They do just well at it as the adults! They also get flying time in both fixed wing and helicopter. They do a "confidence" course with climbing wall and zip-line. They stay in the beautiful log lodge at Pioneer Field across from the museum. Quite the experience."

Burnet CAF Hosts the Bluebonnet Airshow

I was talking with Clell Bond at the airport last week and and he said he thought here was an airshow over in Burnet on the weekend and asked if I wanted to ride along with him if he went. Not being one to pass up an invitation to see an aviation event I couldn't pass up the invitation. The Highland Lakes Squadron of the CAF and the city of Burnet were putting on their [I believe] annual 2016 airshow.

For a small town, Burnet goes all out to create an excellent flying experience. Free parking was provided with free shuttle bus transport right to the front gate. Although we weren't

able to walk among the show planes, they were close enough to get a pretty good look and the army had several helicopters that let you get up close and personal. Army crews were very sociable, answering questions about the 'copters and putting the kids into the pilots seats. Of particular interest to me at the show was an operational P63 King Cobra, one of only 7 remaining in the world in flying condition. It was built in Buffalo, NY my hometown, and one of my aunts had worked on the P39 assembly line during the war.

If you have a chance the next time the show comes around, check it out, its a nice way to spend an afternoon.
