The Wright Brothers Master Pilot Award–is named in honor of Orville and Wilbur Wright who were two American aviation pioneers credited with inventing, building, and flying the world's first successful motor-operated airplane. The Wright Brothers made the first controlled, sustained flight of a powered, heavier-than-air aircraft with the Wright Flyer on December 17, 1903 at Kitty Hawk, North Carolina. The brothers were also the first to invent aircraft controls that made fixed-wing powered flight possible.

#### Eligibility

To be eligible for the Wright Brothers Master Pilot Award, nominees must meet the following criteria:

- Hold a U.S. Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) or Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) pilot certificate.
- Have 50 or more years of civil and military piloting experience or 50 or more years combined experience in both piloting and aircraft operations.
  - Up to 20 years of the required 50 years may be U.S. military experience.
  - The effective start date for the 50 years is the date of the nominee's first solo flight or military equivalent.
  - The 50 years may be computed consecutively or non-consecutively.
- Be a U.S. citizen.
- Have NOT had any airman certificate revoked.

Note: Revocation of any airman certificate will disqualify a nominee for this award.

## EAA Young Eagles Workshop Information

•The workshop will be held on Saturday, February 25, in the Officer's Club on the second floor of the Commemorative Air Force hangar which is located at 1841 Airport Drive in Building 2249, at the San Marcos Regional Airport.

•The workshop begins at 9:00 am and will end at 3 pm. Please arrive on time.

•The workshop registration fee is \$25.00, cash, check, or credit card. Checks should be made out to EAA <u>Chapter 958</u>.

•If you have a fever, cough, or have symptoms of infection, please let us know so we can make arrangements to reschedule you.

•Please bring a lunch with you. We will be at the CAF hangar during the entire day. We will provide water and soft drinks.

•Wear comfortable clothes and close-toed shoes. We will provide safety glasses for you when you are working with tools and power equipment.

•Students will learn about aviation with presentations by EAA members on aerodynamics, flight instruments and pilotage. Group activities include working on worksheets related to the presentations. The students will also work on three "hands on" projects, a wood wing rib assembly, using safety wire to secure a critical component, and bending and riveting aircraft aluminum sheet metal. These skills are frequently used in the construction of homebuilt and certificated aircraft.

• EAA and CAF members will also give the students a tour of the aircraft and displays in the CAF hangar.

We hope you will enjoy the workshop and look forward to seeing you at the San Marcos Airport on Saturday, February 25.
