The Experimental Aircraft Association is encouraging our chapter to participate in Learn to Fly Week, May 15-20. One of the activities that is recommended is an Eagle Flight for adults who are interested in becoming a private, sport, or ultralight pilot.

Eagle flights have some similarity to Young Eagle flights. One difference is that the pilots are assigned a mentor to help guide them through the certification process. Eagle pilots and mentors must be EAA members. The requirements for Eagle pilots are similar to Young Eagles also include:

- Have a valid airman's certificate (sport pilot or greater).
- Possess a current medical certificate (if applicable).
- Be current to carry passengers in the aircraft you plan to use.
- Have a current biennial flight review.
- Conduct flights in an aircraft that is in airworthy condition.
- Have Aircraft Passenger Liability Insurance for the aircraft used (owned, rented, or borrowed).
- Adhere to all applicable Federal Aviation Regulations.
- Complete an Eagle Flight registration form before the flight, signed by you and your participant.

Another difference is the Eagles flight is part of an all-day program with information that future pilots need to know. The presenters can include chapter members and instructors from local flight schools. For more information about Eagle flights, go to the following website:
