Congratulations on your decision to apply for one of our flight training scholarships!

Acquiring a pilot's certificate is a privilege that requires commitment, dedicated study, perseverance, and a willingness to learn. This endeavor should not be taken lightly, but the process will be very rewarding and will, in many ways, change your life.

Flight training is tailored to individual abilities. It is possible the certificate can be completed at a cost below the award limits. However, it is also possible that training completion may require additional funds to be provided by the applicant. If awarded a scholarship, funding will be provided and administered by EAA Chapter One on behalf of the student pilot to start flight training. Continued funding is dependent upon the scholar completing progress reports and meeting training milestones in a timely manner. If accepted, it is expected that consistent progress will be made. There are several checkpoints along the way such as a solo in the first three months and a check ride completed with the first year. Learning to fly is more than learning to manipulate the controls of an airplane. Even after passing the written exam, our scholars should expect to devote time to studying for the oral exam at the final check ride. The chapter will support that course of study. The scholar will commit to a minimum of four volunteer hours per month with EAA Chapter One. A 3rd class medical certificate is required for Private Pilot scholars prior to training as well as passing the written exam. If selected for the scholarship, a local Scholarship Coordinator will help you understand and complete these requirements as well as assist with getting a Student Certificate.

Application Instructions

There are four parts to this application:

- 1. The following pages of the application form are intended to be self-explanatory. Please complete them to the extent possible and attach the requested essay. It is not expected that every question will apply to your circumstances. Pages 3 and 4 need to be emailed to the address below.
- 2. Student Scholastic Record (transcript dated within 30 days of application). These can be unofficial and printed at home via your school grade website

BUT it has to be a PDF and cannot be a screenshot. All information must be able to be seen on the PDF including the school, grade and date range. This needs to be included with the items listed in #1.

- 3. Letter of recommendation from an instructor, employer, or teacher, dated within 30 days of application. Letter must come from a non-family member. Letter should be emailed from author to the address below.
- 4. Submit a copy of your FAA medical and written exam score (if obtained). You may still apply without obtaining them but both are required before a Scholarship is formally offered.
