Flight Safety tip: I learned something this week on a flight to Stillwater that I'll pass along in hopes that no one else makes the same mistake. Climbing out of Claremore I picked up VFR flight following to Stillwater with Tulsa approach, was switched to Kansas City Center just west of Tulsa and expected, just like every single time before, to be handed off to the controller of the arrival towered airport. Anticipating the switch, I put SWO's tower frequency in the flip-flop radio. I saw that I was about to enter Stillwater's airspace, so I contacted Center to remind them of my location. They proceeded to cancel radar services and asked me to contact Stillwater tower. "Uhh Stillwater Tower, Bonanza 5-4-4-Victor, FYI I'm in your airspace!" Not exactly what I said but that's generally how they took it. I explained that I had flight following and was dropped off in their lap without the expected hand-off. They obliged and cleared me to land without another peep on the issue. Concerned, I called the tower and got to speak with the involved controller. He said that flight following/radar services do not require hand-offs although he acknowledged that most (cont'd on page 3)

of the time it is done. He said that one way to handle it is to drop the current controller without a word if they seem busy and contact the arrival tower before entering that airspace. From now on I'll plan to contact the controller well prior to the inbound airspace to be sure of a safe transition. I haven't dug into the AIM, but I plan to look to see what guidance it may have on the topic.

PURSUIT OF THE \$100 HAMBURGER

My co-pilot Maureen and I have flown all over the area in pursuit of good eats and things to do. Here's a quick list of our favorites in no particular order.

Gaston's White River Resort (3M0), Lakeview, AR. Nestled in the beautiful plateaus of the Ozarks in mid-northern Arkansas, Gaston's features an east-west 3200'x55' grass runway along the trout-filled White River just below Bull Shoals Lake. When the winds agree they recommend landing to the west and taking off to the east. It's a unique approach with the hillsides and trees on either side of the runway...and watch out for the gaggle of swan that occasionally manicure the field.

The resort boasts an awarding winning restaurant (the food is good!) that unofficially doubles as an odd museum of antique bikes, outboard boat motors, signage and other trinkets hanging from all available ceiling and wall space...it's worth a walk-around before or after eating. Besides the views on the inside, the restaurant hovers over the cold, clear White River and there is plenty of seating along the large pane windows overlooking the river. Be sure to call ahead for a reservation on popular dates like Mother's and Valentine's Day.

Between the runway and the paralleled river are modest rental cottages of all sizes, most supplied with wood for the fireplace. Ask to tour a few of their pink (yes, pink) cottages and they'll likely throw you a handful of keys and offer the van for a self-tour. In the cold months they offer heavy discounts for their rental cottages.

The resort also features (pricey) 100LL, a good souvenir shop, convenience store and bait shop, boat rentals, fishing guides, nature trails and a neat bird sanctuary just NW of the aircraft tie downs.

Lloyd Stearman Field (1K1), Benton, KS. Just NE of Wichita, Stearman Field's primary attraction is their bar and grill at the northeast end. It has a sports bar look and feel, and the Big Ass fans are a nice touch. One table features a large radial engine as its base and they also have a fire pit bar if the tables are full. They're open at 7am and stay open late 7 days a week. The food is great with a large variety of choices for breakfast, lunch and dinner.

You'll often see and hear the locally-based Stearman bi-planes giving rides or showing off. There are said to be 7 of them based there, which might make sense given the name of the field. You can arrange for a ride by calling ahead.

They also host many events throughout the year. The outdoor stage just off the patio of the bar & grill plays host to live bands year-around, they're known to hosting car and jeep shows, and an annual Halloween event to include a pumpkin drop competition. Check their website for their annual events.

The Beaumont Hotel Airport (075), Beaumont, KS. 45 miles east of Wichita (out in the middle of nowhere) you'll find a unique aviation experience. The town was initially a stage-coach stop between Fredonia and Wichita when in 1879 the hotel was built. (cont'd on page 5)



Later in 1885 it became a stop for the St Louis and San Francisco Railroad better known as the Frisco. A wooden Frisco water tower was built to support the steam engines of that era...it is a sight to see and is on the National Register of Historic Places.

So the unique aspect of this field is the distance between the field and parking across the street from the hotel and diner...about a quarter mile. It makes for an interesting taxi from the south end of the field, west on a road through a four-way stop and then into the parking area on the left. Makes for a great picture with the Frisco train station and water tower in the background.

The hotel has a nice sit-down restaurant area or you can order from the same menu in their 50's-style diner. The food is great although nothing fancy. They're open Thursday thru Sunday this time of year. You can ask to tour the rooms upstairs. They are modest clean rooms, the floors creak, and the hotel is said to be haunted. Ask your waitress to show you the picture they have...it must be true if they have a picture!

Be cautious of the highway at the north end of the field and stay between the yellow cones marking it's borders. 15% of the southern end of the runway grades downward so if you're taking off to the north you won't see much of the runway until you crest the hill.

Kingsley Airfield (MO9), Miller, MO. Just west of Springfield is an interesting 3119'x150' grass/asphalt runway that caters to crop dusting and jump school operations, and those in search of food from the Hangar Kafe. The café sits within a Quonset hut with indoor and outdoor seating, and is decorated with aviation paraphernalia. They have a gift shop adjacent to the outdoor seating, but you may have to ask them to open it for you.

The food is great with a good list of choices for breakfast, lunch and dinner. They're open 7-days starting at 7am, closing at 4pm Sunday thru Wednesday and they stay open until 8 on Thursday, and 9 the rest of the week.

The runway has a fair amount of loose gravel around the asphalt and the south quarter of the field is grass. The grass on the east side of the runway is useable if taking off/landing to the north, but I'd recommend calling ahead for advice.

Pawhuska Municipal (H76), Pawhuska, OK. This airport is a few miles west of town. Most women love this place since it's home to the Pioneer Woman Restaurant and Mercantile. How do you get to town from the airport? I called ahead and found that you just call the city police after landing and they'll give you a lift in and a ride back when you're done...and they're happy to do it.

The Pioneer Woman Restaurant has some great food, but unless you come on a non-holiday weekday, plan to wait in line for a while. We chose the wrong day within the week of Christmas last year during sub-freezing temps, and ended up being seated over 3 hours later...the line is mostly outside. Not on my list of things to do again!

I have an Excel spreadsheet that I've listed nearly 50 airports within 175 nm of KGCM (Claremore Regional) with on-field or nearby points of interests and additional info that I'm happy to share. Feel free to reach out and I'll forward it to you.
