


Tomcat Rio: A Topgun Instructor on the F-14 Tomcat and the Heroic Naval Aviators Who

Flew It by Dave Baranek (Author)

You're in the cockpit of the legendary F-14 Tomcat fighter, blazing along at twice the speed of sound seven miles above the ocean and the carrier that hurled you off its deck. You're practicing dogfighting with "aggressors," guys on your side flying F-16s. You're patrolling the tense skies above Iraq, and with the push of a button you can launch the 100-mile Phoenix missile that can blow a foe to scrap before you even see him. You are an expert in fighter tactics and aircraft carrier operations, and it all leads to your command of an F-14 fighter squadron of more than three hundred people.

The **Lockheed P-38 Lightning** is an American single seated, piston-engined <u>fighter aircraft</u> that was used during <u>World War II</u>. Developed for the <u>United States Army Air Corps</u>, the P-38 had distinctive <u>twin booms</u> and a central <u>nacelle</u> containing the cockpit and armament. Allied propaganda claimed it had been nicknamed the fork-tailed devil (<u>German</u>: *der Gabelschwanz-Teufel*) by the <u>Luftwaffe</u> and "two planes, one pilot" by the Japanese. Along with its use as a general <u>fighter</u>, the P-38 was utilized in various <u>aerial combat</u> roles including as a highly effective <u>fighter-bomber</u>, a <u>night fighter</u>, and as a <u>long-range escort fighter</u> when equipped with <u>drop tanks</u>. The P-38 was also used as a bomber-pathfinder, guiding streams of <u>medium</u> and <u>heavy bombers</u>; or even other P-38s, equipped with bombs, to their targets. Used in the <u>aerial reconnaissance</u> role, the P-38 accepted for ON

We are announcing an opportunity to follow a dream and apply for a flight training scholarship which targets students ages 15-19 here in the local Central Pennsylvania and Northern Maryland areas. Awards are available in the following categories and amounts:

Private pilot training Age 16-19 — \$10,000 Sport pilot training Age 16-19 — \$7,500 Glider training Age 15-19 — \$5,000

The scholarship program is supported by the Ray Foundation managed by EAA, and administered by the EAA Chapter network. Initially interested students are nominated, will complete a written application with references, will be interviewed with parents present, and the selection of the nominee will be completed and announced by a #1041 membership committee. The selected student will then apply to EAA Headquarters who will make the final decision and the one year aviation training program will begin.

This takes a committed student who shows excitement and motivation, meets scholar requirements, is comfortable with and will participate in chapter activities at the airport, and may already have some aviation training and Young Eagle flights.

ATTENTION PROSPECTIVE #1041 MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE: We need your commitment to recommend interested students NOW, and to serve on the committee to evaluate the student's application, personally interview the student and his/her parents, and possibly serve as a mentor throughout the year long process.
