


#### One Day In a Long War

by Jeffrey Ethell | Hardcover

One Day in a Long War records first hand accounts of almost 100 eye witnesses, analyzes cockpit voice recordings, and draws from official documents, many declassified for the first time, to tell its story. During May 10th 1972 an elite corps of fighter pilots—many of them first generation Top Gun graduates—flew more than 330 sorties against major transportation centers around Hanoi and Haiphong. But the North Vietnamese fought back with more that 93 SAMS and 40 MIG fighters. One of the fighter crews was shot down and a crew member survived for 23 days deep in North Vietnam before being rescued by a SAR mission involving more that 100 aircraft. 12 MIGS were shot down as well as 4 US Fighters, 2 Air Force and 2 Navy. Eventual Air Force and Navy Aces were involved in the Air-to-Air battle fought this day. (The largest of the Vietnam War)

#### **Chapter Camping at AirVenture**











#### **Preview of our New Website (Screen Shot)**



Fellow Barnstormers,

I wanted to write to you about a couple of upcoming events that we have on the calendar. While the near future is full of uncertainty with the every changing COVID-19 response, I would like us to be prepared to hold these events should the current restrictions be lifted and the public comfort level allows for them to be held.

The first event is International Learn to Fly Day at the Gettysburg Airport. This is an Eagle Flight

event for adults interested in learning to fly. The club has decided to hold the event on Saturday, May 9th, following the IMC/VMC Club. Our rain dates are Sunday, May 10 or Saturday, May 16. If you are interested in volunteering as an Eagle Pilot or an Eagle Mentor, please email me to let me know (email address is below). I plan on being there along with a young man that I will be Eagle mentoring. If you know any adults that may be interested in learning to fly, please consider reaching out to them with a personal invitation to come to the Learn to Fly Day.

Our second event is International Young Eagles Day. This will be a Young Eagles Rally to be held at the Gettysburg Airport on Saturday, June 13th. Our rain dates are Sunday, June 14th or Saturday, June 20. I would like to get as many pilots as we can to volunteer to fly youth that day. We will also need to have several volunteers on the ground to help coordinate getting applications completed and getting the youth to and from the planes. If you are able to help, please send me an email and let me know you can fly or can help on the ground. Once I have a feel for how many planes will be available, I will be setting up online registration for the event. This will help us control the flow some so we don't get overwhelmed with a sudden rush at the start of the day.

Last thing I wanted to mention. While we are sitting at home maintaining our social distance over the next couple of weeks, please consider completing the EAA Youth Protection Training (YPT) and Background Check. The whole process takes about 15 minutes to complete and is required by EAA in order to volunteer for youth events. With the info that Savy passed on to me and validation from the EAA, I show that we currently have 18 members with the YPT complete (1 expires next month), 1 member that has the background check without the YPT, and 4 that are expired. Again, please consider completing this. If you do complete your YPT and background check, please email me the certificate when you have it.
