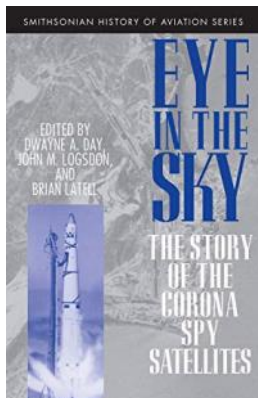

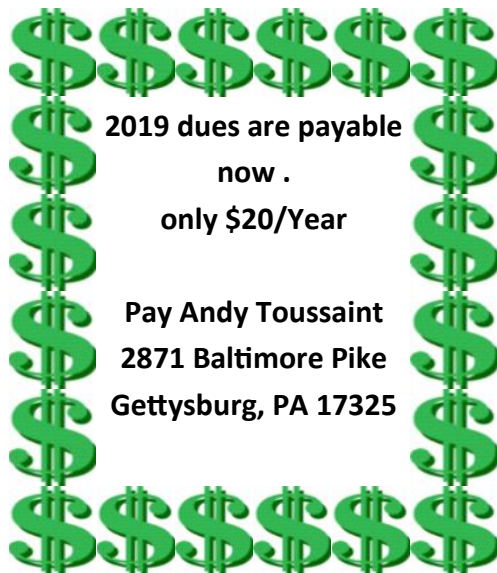
Eye in the Sky: The Story of the Corona Spy Satellites

IMC Question of the Month

The only IMC departure available -- the ODP (Obstacle Departure Procedure) out of KFIT for runway 32 states to: "climb on 324 heading until 2600 MSL before turning." Controlled airspace (E) in this area starts at 1048 MSL. You filed an IFR flight plan and stated in your remarks that you are going to be using ODP.

The clearance you get from Bridgeport Radio is "on entering controlled airspace, fly heading 090" with no mention of the ODP. What are you expected to do? Immediately turn to 090 on entering controlled airspace, as directed, at 1048 MSL, or wait until finishing the ODP, and setting at 2600 MSL? Is statement "on entering controlled airspace fly heading" a vector – meaning that ATC takes responsibility for terrain/obstacles clearance at that point?

VMC Question of the Month:

You just got recurrent at night by doing your three takeoffs and landings to a full stop, are you current for day also since the requirements are more?

Ray Aviation Scholarship

Chapter 1041 was one of the chapters selected for a \$10,000 scholarship. Competition was stiff, over 200 chapters of the 900+ EAA applied. It was an honor to be selected. Now the work and the fun begins.

This was exciting news recently when we were informed that our application for participation in the Ray Aviation Scholarship program had been enthusiastically accepted by EAA headquarters. This means that EAA will provide up to \$10,000 to deserving youths in our immediate geographic area for their flight training expenses, totaling \$1 million in scholarships annually.

Our local chapter will play a critical role in the success of this program, as chapters are responsible for identifying applicants for this scholarship, as well as mentoring and supporting the student throughout the flight training journey.

Students will be expected to complete their flight training experience in 12 months, submit periodic program reports, and commit to chapter volunteer service. This will require a significant amount of time dedicated to the program by the student.

The local RAS committee members are currently accepting names of students who are interested in applying. Basic criteria are (1) between ages of 15-19, (2) active participation in local aviation groups, (3) engagement in EAA youth programs such as EAA Young Eagles or EAA Air Academy, and/or (4) a proven passion for aviation through commitment to earning a pilot certificate.

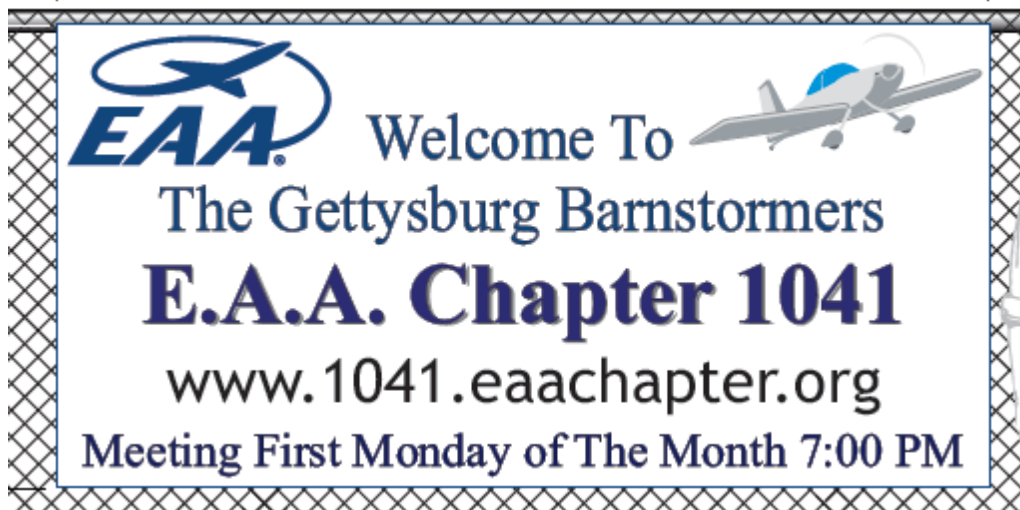
