

As Paul Poberezny once said, "It starts by planting a seed".



A VISIT TO THE IMPERIAL WAR MUSEUM AT DUXFORD, ENGLAND IN OCTOBER

This is a former WW2 aerodrome near Cambridge which is now the home of an excellent collection of military, as well as (mostly) British civil airplanes with an example of all major British airliners from the last 70 years or so, including one of the prototype Concordes. Many years ago I was a member of the gliding club at Duxford and saw the Concorde arrive, piloted by Brian Trubshaw, one of the development pilots. it was very light and used more or less all the runway even with him putting the main gear down just inside the threshold. A few days later work started to extend the major highway running out of London to the NE and this cut off the end of the runway, so even if it were ever possible for this Concorde to be made airworthy again, there is insufficient room for it to take off. It is not unusual to be able to get an airplane into a field you can't get it out of, but not normally because the runway has suddenly got a lot shorter.....the pictures of instrumentation and wiring are from the inside of the Concorde.

Some of the wartime hangars are still in use, and there is an active maintenance base there for a wide selection of warbirds, also open to the public. The film "Battle of Britain" was partly made there in 1969; in the airfield bombing scene they actually blew up one of the original hangars. No CGI in those days, and all that remains is some of the concrete pad on which it stood.




PORT CLINTON, OHIO - OCTOBER 19, 2019






