Chapter 113 provides the opportunity for exchange of information, as well as the interaction that leads to friendships that last a lifetime."





Levil Technology Aviation division will be sponsoring my effort with the flying car, by donating an **ILevil AW** (ahrs,GPS, pfd, ads-b in unit). They were the most encouraging vendor at Airventure 2017, to stop by my booth and offer their enthusiastic support.

Incidentally they also make a simple, independent, ads-b out solution called the Beacon which I have been looking to add to my planes in the near future. This company appears to be doing some very innovative work in this space. I am grateful to them for their support.

Here's some pics of the product and what it does for and iPad or Android tablet.

Relay Technology

The only WIAM that connects your tablet with your panel! Using iLevil's integrated serial ports, data is relayed from panel mounted avionics to tablet and vice versa. - FLARM and TCAS data relay.






IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING MICHIGAN AERONAUTICAL CHARTS


With the new BasicMed regulations in effect, the method of mailing out Michigan Aeronautical Charts has changed.


