

#### INTRODUCING A NEW MONTHLY COLUMN: HINTS AND KINKS By Pete Waters

One of my problems, since I lost the sight of one eye, is setting the drill press or the vertical mill bits to be on the center of a marked hole.

I found a great solution in the "Wixey Drill Press Laser Cross Hairs".

This is their Model # WL133 and sells online for \$37.50.

What a neat tool! I include several photos of the unit, attached to my Drill Press which needed a longer hose clamp because the column diameter is larger.


It has two vertical scanning lasers, that are adjusted so the crossed beams are centered on the "pop mark" for the drill bit.


The power is 3 AA cells, and they will last a long time if you **DO** switch off when completing a task. Yes, I do plan a change to power it from the AC on/off switch for the drill light.


The laser lines are each adjusted so their crossing traces are centered on the "pop" mark made by a center or small drill. The adjustments are a little "rough" as its plastic on plastic, but once set, just be careful with the power switch in case you change the setting. I have tightened the clamp and moved the pillar stop up as well, and show a drill mark with the cross hairs off to the side, and another with them centered.

Yes, it tracks with the drill axis, and I usually switch off the light on the press, when first setting it up.

You will find the low cost tool, a great asset in your machining. Stay tuned for next month's "Hints and Kinks."

#### 2000 Ibs. DEAD WEIGHT DROP ON A 61 Ib. LANDING GEAR

#### FAA AD 2020-25-12 INFO From Martin Filiatrault

Many of our chapter members may be aware of the recent FAA AD 2020-25-12 that calls for the removal and replacement of certain Superior Air Parts crankshafts from existing Superior and Lycoming O/IO-360 engines. I'll include links to the AD below, as well as other links. The short story, as it affects me, is that my new Barrett-built Superior IO-360X engine with 45 minutes of dyno time, that was on course to fly in 2021, is not airworthy and must be rebuilt. This was a devastating blow to my project, but I've received a lot of support from my friends in the experimental and general aviation community. My airplane will indeed fly, but there is now a lot of additional work required... so I got to work. After 24 hours of labor spread over six working days, my engine was removed on Christmas Day. I documented the process with photos and a time lapse video that I shared on my YouTube channel. I've also posted my year-end entry in my Blogspot blog. I currently await future arrangements to be made with Barrett and Superior. My engine is in the pipeline and I'm encouraged by many that my aircraft will still fly in 2021. Do me one favor, though... pray for my sanity... this is a rough one.


