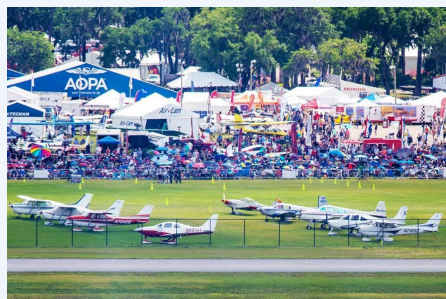
We sincerely thank each and every one of our members who have contributed and take an active role in keeping our Chapter active, strong, and always looking for new opportunities to promote aviation in our community.

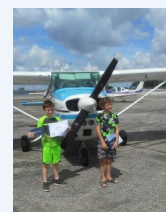
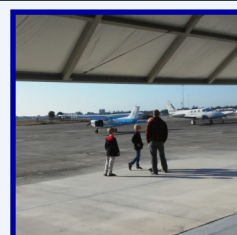


We flew 12 Young Eagles in January.

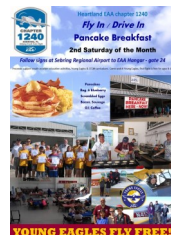
