-LOOKING FOR A HOME: You may have noticed the wooden aircraft frame and wing in our hangar. It was donated to the Chapter. With our current build project, the Board has decided that this project will probably not occur any time soon, if at all. It is available at no cost to the first person to request it.

It is a partially completed wooden aircraft fuselage frame, one wing, horizontal and vertical tail assembly, and wood pieces for finishing the project. We have no information about the model; all the pieces may not be here. This does not appear to be a flyable aircraft, but perhaps a display; art project, or who knows. It has been sitting in this condition for about 30 years, and is dry, and some pieces are beginning to come loose. A very lightweight display quality "landing gear" assembly is included.
