Minutes of a regular meeting of The Chapter held on June 10th, 2015, at the Epic Aircraft facility at the Bend Municipal Airport.

#### **ATTENDEES**

#### **PROGRAM**

The program for the evening consisted of a tour of the Epic Air facility that began at 6:15pm conducted by Epic Air's Mike Schrader, who took those assembled on a most interesting visit through all phases of the Epic operation.



#### **CALL TO ORDER**

Concluding the tour, the Business portion of the meeting was formally called to order in the Epic Air lobby at 7:20 pm by President Phy who dispensed with the Treasurer's report and Minutes which were published in the monthly newsletter.

He then revealed that, based upon an incident which occurred during the last meeting on May 13, he came up with an idea for a perpetual trophy which encompassed a rustic wooden base and the **engraved** shattered remains of a propeller, occasioned by a mishap during an engine start-up exhibition which had turned into an un-planned taxi demonstration and collision with a hangar door during the meeting.



Initial awardees included Jack "Ground Loop" Watson, for an incident which occurred during the maiden flight of his KitFox 7 in 2009, and most recently Dale Anderson who piloted the Chapters RV-12 Project during the ill-fated aforementioned taxi demonstration. Also Included on the engraved blade was the name of late Bruce Myers, who was fatally injured in a take-off accident in his RV-9A at Prineville during a flight on January 11<sup>th</sup> of this year.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

There followed a series of announcements concerning the need for volunteers for a period of two hours to help with the Hayward Air Rally which will be arriving in Bend on Friday, June 12, attendance at Oshkosh as well as the Reno Air Races and the fact that we will again have booth space at the Air Show of the Cascades which will be held at the Madras Airport the weekend of August 28<sup>th</sup> & 29<sup>th</sup>.

We wanted to provide events that were small scale, safe, and more significant to young people sincerely interested in becoming pilots. We began meetings called YES (Young Eagle Support) group. These meetings were scheduled for one hour prior to the regular chapter monthly meeting. They were also invited to attend the chapter meeting if appropriate and convenient.

It seems to be working. Through the year we had a small group of potential Young Eagles, along with parents attend the meetings. We provided them with ground school topics and fun activities A few did get a YE flight related to flight. arranged through the winter months. meetings also provided a method of recruiting friends to learn more about Young Eagle opportunities and what aviation is all about. The parents are also engaged in meetings if they choose, The YES meetings provide more support and understanding of the pilot training process. We intend to keep the Young Eagle engaged in aviation and to follow through with the Sporty's opportunities.

June 13 was a beautiful day in Bend, with light wind and blue skies, for the "International Learn to Fly Day" and Young Eagles Flights. Five pilots with a variety of aircraft successfully flew an aspiring group of Young Eagles.

Our thanks go out to three pilots from Bend Chapter 1345 and two Pilots from Chapter 617 in Prineville, who came to help out. The group of Young Eagles was intentionally small with four YES attendees and several newbies.

We did no official advertising aside from our chapter website and facebook page postings, though we should have. As it worked out, we had enough pilots and planes to accommodate more Young Eagles. We intend to do more small events more often in the future. We also plan to continue YES as the primary method of organizing, educating, and helping future pilots.

On June 12<sup>th</sup>, Chapter members again helped with the arrival of the Rally participants at Bend Muni.


