Ray Aviation Scholarship Announcement

From Ray Scholarship Coordinator, Jeff Stolasz

Our chapter has been granted a Ray Aviation Scholarship to award to a young potential aviator/scholar for 2023.

The EAA Ray Aviation Scholarship is a scholarship program that is funded by the Ray Foundation, managed by the EAA national organization, and administered through the EAA Chapter network. Through the generous support of the Ray Foundation, EAA provides up to \$11,000 to deserving youths to help cover their flight training expenses, totaling \$1,800,000 in annual scholarship funding.

Local candidates must be able to meet the following criteria:

- Minimum of age 15 for glider training
- Age 16-19 for powered flight training
- Possession of a student pilot certificate
- Possession of FAA medical certificate (private pilot students)
- Be able to begin their flight training within 60 days of receiving the award

Additional consideration will be given to candidates who are former Young Eagles, EAA student members, and actively participating in the EAA Flight Plan, specifically the Sporty's Learn to Fly Course.

Once selected by the chapter, the candidate will also be screened by EAA through an application process. If approved by EAA, the scholarship recipient will have to comply with the following requirements:

- Partake in two hours of chapter volunteer service per month, such as:
 - Young Eagles rally volunteering
 - o Volunteer at pancake breakfast/fly-ins
 - o Chapter build project support
 - Chapter gathering participation
 - Chapter social media and website maintenance
- Submit regular progress reports during monthly check-ins
- Reach designated flight training milestones, as outlined by EAA's training timeline

To formally apply for the program please submit the following via email with the subject Ray Scholar application.

- Name
- Address
- Email address
- Phone number
- Age
- If the applicant is a minor, parent or legal guardian's name, address, email, and phone.

Questions to answer:

- 1. What Pilot certification do you desire? (glider, sport pilot, or private pilot)
- 2. What is your experience and desires with aviation in your past, present and any plans for the future?
- 3. If awarded the Scholarship, how do you plan to stay engaged with the chapter?
- 4. In your own words write a 150-200 word explanation of why you should be selected for the Ray Aviation Scholarship.

Timeline

- Submit your application to the chapter by April 17th
- Chapter will notify the nominee of chapter acceptance by April 21st
- Obtain FAA 3rd class medical and student pilot license
- Apply to EAA National via online form
- EAA notifies the scholar of final acceptance by 10th of the following month

In summary; it looks very likely we will meet and exceed our goal of 25 kids, and rather than turn kids away, I'm asking for your help to make 30 kids a possibility. To do this we need more hands on deck. Specifically we need:

- 1. At least **two more EAA pilots**. We have 7 now. If-like last year-one of our pilots has an issue that day and can't fly, we're really hurting.
- 2. At least **2 yellow vested Escorts** to make sure we keep civilians from self-directed excursions onto the flight line.
- 3. At least **two yellow vested Ground Crew** to help prevent our guests from self-directed excursions into the Bend Builders areas. Even well intended kids or adults can cause damage.

So, thanks to all the pilots, ground marshals, registration crew who have already volunteered. Now we need to lend a hand so May 6th is safe, fun, rewarding.



AIR TRAFFIC CONTROL TOWER UPDATE

As indicated in the March Airport Newsletter, the proposed Bend ATCT is required to pass an Operational Readiness Inspection by October 2025 in order to remain a candidate for the Federal Contract Tower Program. Barring no unforeseen circumstances (like funding), the City is on target to meet this deadline. LIMITATIONS ON NIGHT APPROACH PROCEDURES UPDATE

As indicated in the February Airport Newsletter, the City recently removed several obstructions (trees) to navigable airspace. This was done because over the past several years, several of the Instrument Approach Procedures (IAP) have had "Night Not Authorized" (Night-NA) limitations in place due to approach surface obstructions identified in the FAA Flight Procedures Team (FPT) obstacle database. I and consultants have been working with the FAA and Airport neighbors to mitigate the necessary obstructions to remove the "Night-NA" limitations in the IAPs. In a recent meeting, the FAA-FPT verified that the identified obstructions have been addressed and the "Night-NA" limitations will be removed from the relevant procedures during the June 2023 publication period.



Kit: Just Highlander

Recently on the Highlander I assembled the right wing flap and aileron to match what I previously did on the left wing. The control surfaces were attached and I installed the pulleys for the control cables along with all the fabric backing plates around the openings. I reattached both wings hopefully for the last time before I take them off for fabric. I ran flap and aileron control cables in the wings and fuselage. I am currently working on a custom mount for the Dynon heated pitot probe which has a built in AOA sensor.
