

January 18, 1911

At 11:01 a.m., Eugene Ely, flying a Curtiss pusher, landed on a specially built platform aboard the armored cruiser USS *Pennsylvania* at anchor in San Francisco Bay. At 11:58 he took off and returned to Selfridge Field, San Francisco, completing the earliest demonstration of the adaptability of aircraft to shipboard operations.

SECURITY & DEFENSE UPDATE

While the P-8 Poseidon “sub hunter” is monitoring the oceans, sometimes foreign jets intercept the plane during its missions.

Most engagements are standard. Yet, America’s adversaries still conduct unsafe flight maneuvers that get too close for comfort.
