It has only one ax to grind and that is to promote SPORT AVIATION AND THE EXPERIMENTAL AIRCRAFT MOVEMENT to the fullest possible extent. It is not necessary that you build or anticipate building an aircraft in order to become a member. Just a genuine interest is all that is required. Dues for membership in Chapter 14 are \$6.00 per year. This money is used to get out the news letter, send delegates to meetings in which Chapter 14 has an interest, help defray costs of Fly-In's, and to worthy projects to which we address ourselves. Complete and accurate accounting, required by law, is kept by the clubs treasurer. Chapter 14's membership is now 103. Members are building approximately 55 aircraft. Husband and wife memberships are available at the cost of only \$6.00.

Chapter 14, EAA, holds monthly meetings at the Aero-Space Museum, Laurel Street, Balboa Park, San Diego, Calif. The door opens at 6:30 P.M. and the meeting starts at 7:30 P.M. The business part of the meeting is kept as short as possible. An entertaining and educational program, dealing with aircraft subjects follows the business meeting.

You are invited to participate in this movement by joining SAN DIEGO CHAPTER 14, EXPERIMENTAL AIRCRAFT ASSOCIATION. If you have further questions regarding the club then the people listed at the top of this page may be able to supply you with the answers.






