Vice-President's Message

New Member Introduction

Hello, I'm Gary Abel, the new vice-president of the High River EAA chapter. I'd like to introduce myself.

I grew up an air force brat. My father was a wireless air gunner (WAG) during the second world war and later a career Electronics Tech in the RCAF. I grew up on airbases throughout Canada and one in France. This early exposure to aviation was very influential to my interest in flying. I have one special memory when as a boy I got to sit in an RCAF F-86 Golden Hawk while my Dad worked on it.

I'm a commercially licensed pilot having started flying back in 1975 at the Toronto Island Airport, now known as the Billy Bishop Airport. Shortly after moving to Calgary and earning my private license in 1979 I purchased a 1977 Grumman Traveller that I tied down at the Calgary International Airport. At the time me and about thirty other aircraft owners tied down in the field just a few hundred meters from landing 747's. We were paying \$140.00 each year for the privilege of constantly wiping soot off our wings from the landing, taxiing and departing jet aircraft.

I proudly made my career in policing with the Calgary Police Service and retired in 2007.

In 1987, at the High River Airport under the tutelage of the late great Gordon Jones, I completed my commercial pilot's licence. I also served on the High River Airport commission back then for a short term.

After acquiring my commercial license, I flew charter flights part-time in Cessna 182s for an operator in Calgary, and C-172s occasionally for Gordon Jones at High River Flight Services. I was recently the airport manager at Okotoks for three years while it was going through a lengthy certification and auditing process by Transport Canada. That was a terrific learning experience, though I wouldn't want to repeat it.

More recently I've been offered a contract to manage the High River Airport. I'm looking forward to that position and to working with both the airport users and the High River Airport Board.

For the past five years I have owned, flown and immensely enjoyed a very red, and very fast Van's RV-7. Home for my plane will be the newly built hanger owned by Courtney Gillis on the east side of the field.

I also look forward to meeting, working with and flying with more of our chapter members.
