Vice-President's Message By Kelvin Downs

June is shaping up to be a busy month for our Chapter starting with our regular meeting on June 1. There will be two topics for discussion plus our feature presentation arranged by Soren Christiansen. There is a requirement for pilots and other volunteers who will be participating to complete EAA's Youth Protection Training and background check. Another order of business is a quick discussion to have members voice their perspective on the Transport Canada proposal to "decouple VFR flight conditions from a set of defined meteorological conditions and instead coupling it to flight conditions using criteria such as discernible horizon, cultural lighting, and celestial lighting. This discussion could get very involved and possibly emotional so we will limit this discussion so that we can get on with the main presentation of the evening.

Our main presentation has been arranged by Soren Christiansen and will be presented by a couple of representatives from **Canadian UAVs**.

*Canadian UAVs is the only Remotely Piloted Aircraft System (RPAS) company to be given Beyond Visual Line of Sight (BVLOS) certification from Transport Canada. They are the only Operator allowed to fly at night and at a height of 800 feet above ground level, higher than other drone companies.



Young Eagles Pilot Requirements

The Young Eagles pilot requirements are basic, but MUST be followed.

- Be a current EAA® member and hold an appropriate airman's certificate (sport pilot or greater).
- Possess a current medical certificate (if applicable).

- Be current to carry passengers in the aircraft you plan to use.
- Have a current flight review.
- Complete the Young Eagles registration form before the flight, including parent or legal guardian signature, and pilot signature.
- Conduct flights in an aircraft that is in airworthy condition.
- Have aircraft passenger liability insurance for the aircraft used (owned, rented, or borrowed) with \$100,000 per seat coverage.
- Adhere to all applicable Canadian Air Regulations (CARs).
- Complete both the online training and basic background check as a part of EAA's Youth Protection Policy. For more information visit https://www.eaa.org/eaa/youth/youth-protection-policy-and-program

Guidelines for conducting a Young Eagles Flight

Before the Flight

- Complete the Young Eagles registration form, signed by you and each of your passengers. A parent and/or legal guardian signature is required for all Young Eagles flights.
- Discuss what you will see and do on your flight, including reviewing charts and identifying reference points.
- Stress ramp safety, emphasizing caution around propellers and moving aircraft. No hot loading.
- Conduct a pre-flight inspection and identify the parts that control the airplane.
- Describe the aircraft interior and explain the operation of the aircraft door, safety belts, and shoulder harnesses (if installed).
- Allow time to answer any questions before you start your engine.

During the Flight

 Maintain a common-sense approach to the flight, applying see-and-avoid techniques at all times.

- Plan your flight to be as pleasant as possible. Flights must be completed in Day VFR conditions.
- Participants may follow along on the controls, but you must remain in command of the aircraft at all times. No aerobatic maneuvers, unusual attitudes, or formation flights are permitted.
- Young Eagles must use a seatbelt at all times; no changing of seats while airborne.
- No more than three Young Eagles can be flown at one time.

After The Flight

- Congratulate your new Young Eagle!
 Reward them with their very own Young
 Eagles logbook, along with an entry for today's flight.
- Encourage the young person to activate their Young Eagles Flight Plan benefits by following the directions on the back of the logbook. Benefits include:
- FREE EAA Student Membership
- FREE Access to Sporty's Learn to Fly Course (\$279 value)
- Access to FREE EAA AeroEducate activities
- Ability to earn a FREE flight lesson voucher

Survival Weekend (Reposted from last month) Kelvin Downs

At our recent meeting, the group expressed interest in organizing a Survival Weekend, and a date was set for June 17th and 18th, weather and logistics permitting.

Our plan for the weekend is as follows: we will fly into the Red Deer Forestry Strip (CFR7) on Saturday, June 17th, arriving at approximately 1400. Once there, we will review basic survival skills, including shelter building, fire building, water procurement and purification, signalling for help, and basic first aid.

Participants will have the opportunity to apply these practical skills with the items they have brought as part of their survival kit. Following this, we will enjoy a group dinner with burgers, chilli, and maybe even some pizza. We'll then gather around the campfire for some beer and camaraderie before retiring to our shelters for the night.

The next morning, we will provide a group breakfast before embarking on a navigation and orientation session with a scavenger hunt to practice the skills discussed. Finally, we will hold a short debriefing session, where participants can share their experiences and newfound confidence in facing wilderness survival.

Departure will be approximately 1400 on Sunday June 18.

We want to make sure that everyone enjoys the event, so we will arrange to have necessary supplies and creature comforts, including your tents and sleeping bags, brought into the site with a couple of vehicles. Additionally, we will provide cooking and meals beyond what you are able to bring in aircraft. As there is no cell phone service, we will arrange a satellite phone and SPOT in case of any emergencies.

We look forward to seeing you at the Survival Weekend and having a great time together. The logistics and planning will depend on the number of people participating. Please let me know at the next meeting or by email if you are intending on participating. downskelvin@gmail.com
