L.S.A. UPDATES

The FAA's just-revealed report that it would consider raising the light sport aircraft limit from 1320 pounds to 3600 pounds is just a proposed talking point and any rule is at least a year and a half away, according to EAA. NPRM (Notices of Proposed Rule Making) would appear in January '19, when in fact the rulemaking process will start.

The Modernization of Special Airworthiness Certificates (MOSAIC), is part of Aircraft Certification Service's comprehensive approach to becoming more efficient and effective. It represents a move away from prescriptive standards toward performance and risk-based measures.



The current maximum takeoff weight for LSAs, set at 1,320 pounds, was established in the original 2004 sport pilot/light sport rule. But, with a future revision to the definition, LSA limits may be performance-based and incorporate new systems and technologies—including electric propulsion, which is currently prohibited. With any change to the definition, additional aircraft would be expected to become eligible for sport pilot operation.

OCTOBER BONFIRE

It's a good thing there's not an automatic sprinkler system in the main hangar.
