AMAZON DRONES:

Amazon released plans to use drones for under-30-minute deliveries, near its distribution center locations. My bet is that it is a publicity stunt. It makes us think that Amazon can accomplish anything they put their mind to, but it raises more than a few questions.



If an aircraft carries persons or freight

for hire, it needs to be certified. If the FAA lets Amazon bypass this, I can see the rest of the industry coming down hard. Boeing, Cessna & others spend millions on certification, and they won't appreciate Amazon getting a free pass.

And what about the 30 minute daytime / 45 minute night extra reserve rule? I bet the total range of the drones is around 60 minutes. The drones will have to carry more batteries to meet the rule, thus reducing payload or needing more power... a vicious cycle.

Will it deliver at night? It needs position lighting. Will it be all-weather? It would need to be waterproof. Will it lose GPS signal in bad weather?
