President's Corner

May 2019

Let's go fly and have some fun!

Flying – something I wish to do but find little time to do! May is usually a great time to spread the wings and get back into the groove in the air. This year is different for two reasons: Rain and Farm. There has been a



lot of rain this spring, which means fewer excellent weather days for this VFR pilot to remind himself why he submits to BFRs and medicals. But today, Saturday May 11, is an extraordinary day: clear skies, reasonable temps, and light winds. That brings us to Farm. My daughter and son-in-law purchased a produce farm in April. The work load is tremendous. So instead of flying, I help on the farm. Today I fixed an irrigation filtering system, worked on a zero turn stand up mower, and then mowed the apple orchard. Did you know that you can't wave to someone while driving a zero turn stand up mower? Take your hand off one lever to wave and that wheel stops. You begin an uncontrolled rapid rotation toward the still attached hand which throws you toward said hand. The controlling hand is now gripping the control lever even harder which increases the velocity of the rotation even more. It was like a mower version of a flat spin. I was not thrown from the mower but I do believe that that circular section of grass won't need mowing the rest of the season. I should have gone flying.

Let me also discuss our biggest fund raiser, the Early Ford V-8 Car Show and Parts Swap. We cook for this event, and it begins early - 4:30 AM early. So many of you FPA members supported us with set-up, cooking, cashiering, food handling, and teardown. Although the weather wasn't the best, we did quite well. Our goal is \$3,000 after expenses. It looks like we came in somewhere between \$2,800 and \$2,900. Very good for a cold, cloudy day. I am amazed at the commitment many of you provide to support this event. It is important to the FPA and helps keep dues at the \$50 level. Thank you so much to all of you who helped.

Finally, STEM. STEM is an event put on by Massport to encourage high school kids to enter into the Sciences, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. We have an opportunity to influence a life. So, although it is really cool to fly into Logan with the big iron, it is also our chance to maybe change someone's path. There are many jobs in aviation and not all involve flying. We need to be ready to discuss the many opportunities that aviation can provide.

How has your flying been lately? If it's like mine – it's

non-existent. April has had something like 26 days of rain! And when it's not raining, there are low clouds all but preventing any VFR flying at least. What's a pilot to do? One option is to spend a little time on a flight simulator and keep your skills sharp and

your aviation blood flowing!

Thanks to some tremendous contributions from a few members, the EAA Chapter 1454/FPA has a phenomenal new tool – a high end PC based flight simulator program

- Full yoke & rudder pedals
- Nearly complete and functional aircraft front panel for most GA single and dual engine aircraft including dual nav-radios
- Multiple aircraft including C172, Mooney Ovation, SR20, & Piper Archer
- Immersive 3 screen set up
- X-Plane based simulator with NE US high resolution graphics (pilotage is now a real option for navigation)
 - Set the aircraft, location, weather, wind, gusts and failures



We are ready to start opening up the simulator to FPA members for their use. We ask that all users get an orientation on set up and use of the simulator from one of the committee members or the Saturday morning CDL2 hosts before jumping on. This is because there are some idiosyncrasies in turning on the PC and using the sim that you need to be aware of to make the experience enjoyable and prevent you from inadvertently mucking up system settings — which will then take one of us too long to undue! ③ It's not complicated, but we want to be there to walk you through it and answer any set up questions for you.

If you recall from our previous discussions at FPA meetings the purpose of the flight simulator is:

- a) To introduce flying to non-pilots with fun experiences on the simulator. We plan to have one of our members host the simulator during Y/E events and Aero Fair for example.
- b) To provide certificated pilots with an opportunity to hone their skills. This is done by opening up specific scenarios that we have pre-written for you.

The scenario flights are just a list of flights you can take where the aircraft, location, weather, etc. have all been pre-set. This allows you to save time on the simulator and focus on the skill you are building. For example, we have a gusty xwind landing at KFIT set up where you are essentially pointed at the runway when the simulation starts. You just line up and land... with appropriate wind corrections of course! You don't need to start the aircraft, take off, etc. Once you land you can continue on with take offs and more landings of course.



We are busy adding a number of scenarios to choose from. Feel free to offer your suggestions. Next month I'll start highlighting some of the available scenarios. It all starts with an orientation. Come in on any Saturday morning during the CDL2 coffee hour. If you can't fly in the air for any reason, you can still fly on the ground and feed the aviation beast! If you have any questions or comments, feel free to reach out to me directly.
